**Attention Scouts**  
If you are a Scout reading this news item and are registered for either the first or second periods at Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan, you should consider yourself indeed lucky. Both first and second periods are now closed to registration. There is still plenty of room in the third period beginning August 5, but Scouts planning attending camp this summer should not delay sending in their reservations.

There are two new villages at Camp Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan, Mohawk and Iroquois. The Village of Blackfoot has been eliminated in favor of an ideally perfect site. Complete new equipment has been purchased for both Mohawk and Iroquois Villages, including tent platforms, tents, and cots.
