

Rev. T. R. Quayle Dies; Funeral Services Today

Funeral services will be held at 9:30 a.m. today (Thursday) at his home on Scranton avenue, Lake Bluff, for Rev. T. R. Quayle, who passed away Tuesday. A second service will be held at 2 p.m. at Oswego, Ill., where he will be buried. Mr. Quayle, who was 85 years old at the time of his death, served as secretary of the Lake County Law and Order league from 1905 to 1930. Through his campaigning against liquor, vice and gambling, he was credited with establishing the dry zone around Fort Sheridan and the Great Lakes Naval Training Station in the pre-prohibition days. Born in England, Mr. Quayle came to the United States in 1882. Previous to his term with the Law and Order league, he served as minister of the Presbyterian church of Libertyville for three years. Surviving are his widow, Fannie, and a son, William Hamilton Quayle.

mer training, and will march back to Sheridan as part of the battalion in September. In addition to the men, some 100 horses will also be sent to this post from various government remount stations. The largest motor repair shop in the Sixth Corps area has been recently completed at Sheridan. In this shop, all major repairs to motor vehicles in the Sixth Corps Area will be made. In order to accomplish this work, it has been found necessary to increase Company "E" of the Sixth Quartermaster Regiment, regularly stationed at Fort Sheridan, by transferring some 40 men from the 58th Quartermaster Regiment at Jeffersonville, Ind. The 61st Coast Artillery (anti-aircraft), stationed at Sheridan, now consists of a Headquarters Battery, a Searchlight Battery ("A"), a Machine Gun Battery ("B"), and a 3 inch Gun Battery ("E"). It has been learned that the War Department intends to increase this regiment by adding another 3 inch Battery, namely, Battery "C".

The above additions will increase the present personnel of Fort Sheridan by some 200 men. There will also be an increase of about 100 horses, plus equipment. Further details will be released when received here at Sheridan.

The increase in the sale of Illinois fishing licenses in the first five months of 1939 as compared with the same period last year indicates

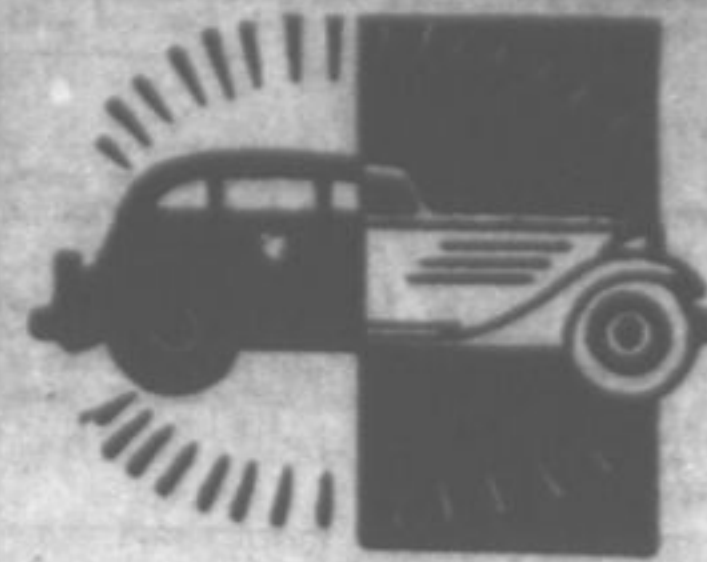
that the popularity of fishing as a sport is also increasing. J. V. Maloney, chief clerk of the department of conservation reports.

Local Boys Leave on Bicycle Trip Through the West

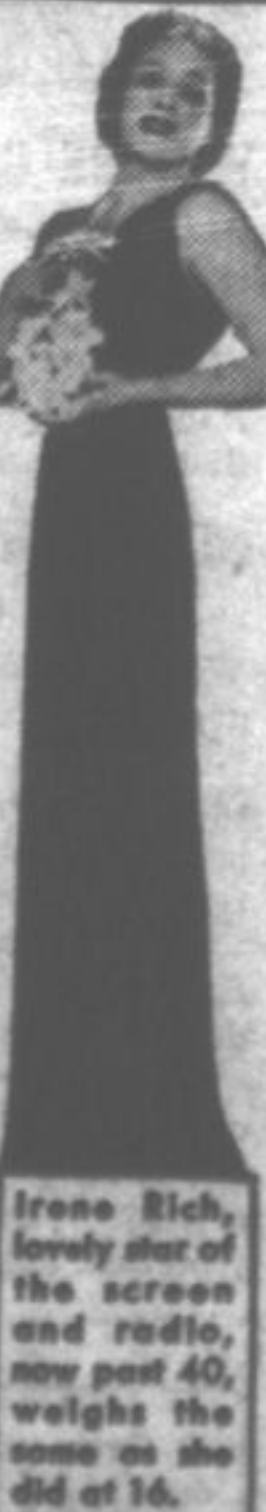
