

Open Lake Forest Home For Charity Event



The "House of the Day After Tomorrow," the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Bertram J. Cahn, 270 South Western avenue, Lake Forest, will be open from 9 to 5 on Tuesday, July 11, for the annual summer sale of the Victory Workshop, a charitable organization for the deaf and hard of hearing.

The Cahn house, less than two years old, is considered one of the outstanding examples of modern architecture in this country. Picture windows in every room that look out on a naturally wooded landscape, serve to make the exterior a component part of the interior. Each piece of furniture has been specially designed for purely functional purposes.

The Victory Workshop is an organization, founded in 1924, to give occupational training and instruction to Chicago's deaf and hard of hearing young people. The items sold in the sale have been made by these unfortunate, handicapped persons who have finished their school work, and have come to the Victory Workshop to learn a trade, so that they will be able to find employment. Through the cooperation of the Illinois Free Employment Bureau, the Victory has been able to place many students in permanent positions. Through the cooperation of the W. P. A., the Chicago Board of Education, and private subscribers . . . milk, carfare,

materials, and teachers are provided, to the end of making these individuals self sufficient.

Many articles bought at the Victory Workshop sale cannot be purchased elsewhere. This year there are several new items. There will be a wooden table setting with hand-turned fruit (made at the Workshop) for a centerpiece, lumbar hand painted doilies, and a large selection of doilies, and breakfast sets starting at \$1.00. The children's gifts and furniture are more attractive than ever before. There are many new toys and household items. The money realized from all sales is given to the students.
