

Reserve Officers at Fort Largely from Chicago Area

Chicago and Cook county have furnished the largest percentage of Reserve Officers who are now going through a course of intensive staff training at Fort Sheridan, Ill. Chicago's own military post, commanded by Brigadier General Karl Truesdell, U. S. Army.

The majority of these officers are assigned to the 86th "Blackhawk" Division, Illinois' own outfit. The Division's history goes back to the World War. It was one of the National Army Divisions organized and manned by Illinois men during 1917-18. According to Colonel John B. Johnson, Cavalry, U. S. Army, Senior Instructor of the Division, the 86th will again be composed of Illinois men should a national emergency arise.

In addition to the 86th Division Staff, the following other staff units are being trained: 6th Division; 65th Cavalry Division; the 11th, 12th, 171st and 172nd Infantry Brigades; and the 159th and 160th Cavalry Brigades.

For two years, Morris has been superintendent of buildings and grounds of the public schools at Keokuk, Iowa, the position which he will leave to come to Lake Forest. During the last five years, he has taught summer courses in "Custodian-Engineering" at several state colleges in South Dakota.
