Rigotti explained to Jensen that he was searching for his daughter, Delores, who had disappeared from the Columbus Memorial hospital in Chicago where she was a student nurse. He then asked the police sergeant to broadcast a description of the girl over the police radio. Jensen obliged and the message was picked up by the Lake county sheriff's office

and given wider circulation. Rigotti then drove toward Chicago, leaving word as to where he could be reached in case the police were successful in their hunt for the missing girl.

Fifteen minutes after the Highland Park police had received the message the girl was located trying to thumb a ride on Sheridan road in Highland Park. Her father was notified and he returned to Highland Park to pick her up.

Asked why she had run away the girl replied that she was tired of her nursing career and did not want to go back.
