

Heroic Canine Is to Be Honored at Kennel Club Show

The color of a dog's eyes and the stance of his forelegs may be of prime importance to the judges at the Shore Land Kennel Club show, to be held September 17 at Onwentsia Country Club, but the spirit and courage that have made dog "man's best friend" will not be overlooked.

With that statement, Mrs. Berndalyn Kewley, secretary of the kennel club, announced a search for the dog along the North Shore that recently performed the most heroic act. When this canine companion, pure bred or mongrel, is singled out it will be honored at the show by officials of National Dog Week. In addition to a certificate of merit a medal will be struck in the dog's honor.

Judges of the search will be Dr. W. A. Young and Howard Lawyer of the National Dog Week committee, and Mrs. Kewley.

"While the purpose of a dog show is to honor that dog which exemplifies the very best physical qualities of its breed, this year, because National Dog Week opens on the day of our show, we shall in addition pay tribute to the high moral courage and fine heroism of the dog," Mrs. Kewley said.

"The shape of a dog's skull is important, but what is inside that skull is important, too," she continued. "Perhaps the dog warned his mistress of a fire in the home, or called attention to a drowning child, or any one of a hundred heroic acts. We want to know of these feats and call upon everyone who knows of such a case to write us about it at once. Of course these stories of loyalty and devotion must bear investigation by the judging committee and we ask that newspaper editors and police officials in particular advise us of any such instances of heroism."
