Conduits Made of Wood
Some of the wooden pipes once commonly used as water conduits in Illinois, continued in service until early in the 20th century. It is said that the missionaries who stopped at Falling Springs, St. Clair county, to teach the Indians, harnessed the water by means of hollow logs and used its power to operate their mill.

As late as 1915, the rapidly growing city of Elmhurst, DuPage county, according to research workers of the Federal Writers' Project, WPA, who are compiling historical information to be used in guide books, depended solely upon six inch wooden water mains leading from springs, three miles distant, for its water supply.

Schooling Costs County Taxpayers \$174.12 Per Pupil

The average yearly cost to Lake county taxpayers, for educating each of the 19,892 boys and girls in attendance in the county's elementary and high school during the past year was \$174.12 according to the audit of the accounts of all public school districts in the county recently completed by W. S. Petty, superintendent of schools.

Of the total expenditure of \$3,463,486.65 in the 100 grade school districts, 10 high school districts and the non-high school area, \$1,991,142.04 went for educational purposes and \$125,009.78 for building repairs and additions. The remainder, or \$1,347,334.83, was for the retirement and interest on school bond issues.

The total bonded indebtedness of all the districts, including high school and elementary schools, is \$2,945,831.
State Pays \$124,206
During the past year \$124,206.68

was received by the grade schools from the state distributive fund. This fund, an average of \$11 for each boy and girl, was distributed in monthly installments by Supt. Petty.

Records for the school year ending last June show that 1,402 boys and girls received their education in the 62 one-room schools and 12,601 pupils in city and village schools having two or more teachers. There were 5,889 students in the high schools.

Claims by the various grade schools against the state distributive fund, based on the 14,003 boys and girls in the elementary school system for the year ending in June, totalled \$126,442.61. Of the total number registered, only 13,012 were listed as full time pupils.

The Waukegan grade school district entered the largest claim in the county with \$37,422 for 3,402 boy and girls. Fremont Center made the smallest claim, asking for \$14.63.

Onwentsia Polo Team Will Meet Army Team Sunday

Several Government Positions Available

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced open competitive examinations for the positions listed below. Applications must be on file in the Commission's office at Washington, D.C., not later than September 18 if received from States east of Colorado, and not later than September 21 if received from Colorado and States westward.

Junior engineer, \$2,000 a year. Optional branches are aeronautical, and naval architecture. Applicants must not have passed 35th birthday.

Junior marketing specialist, \$2,000 a year, various optional subjects, in the Agricultural Marketing Service of the Department of Agriculture. Applicants must not have passed their 35th birthday.

Psychologist, \$3,800 a year, associate psychologist, \$3,200 a year, and assistant psychologist, \$2,600 a year. Employment is in the Children's Bureau (Department of Labor), and U. S. Public Health Service (Federal Security Agency). Applicants for the psychologist grade must not have passed their 33rd, for the associate grade they must not have passed their 45th, and for the assistant grade they must not have passed their 40th, birthday.

Associate physical oceanographer, \$3,200 a year, Treasury Department. Employment in this position includes service at sea for about 5 months each year. Completion of a 4-year college course including work in physics and calculus, and professional experience in physical science are required. Certain education may be substituted for the ex-
