

Jewish New Year to Be Observed Wednesday, Sept. 13

Celebration of Rosh Hashono, the Jewish New Year, will begin on the eve of the first day of the year, 5700, on Wednesday, Sept. 13. The holiday falls on the first day of Tishri, the seventh month in the Jewish calendar.

Services will be held at the North Shore Congregation Israel on Wednesday, Sept. 13, 8:15 p.m. and Thursday morning, Sept. 14, at 10 o'clock. Rabbi Shulman will conduct the services. On Thursday morning, Sept. 14, special children's services will be conducted by Mrs. Avis Shulman. Further information may be obtained by communicating with the Temple office, Glencoe 725.

New Year and Atonement Day, the holy day which occurs ten days later, differ from most Jewish festivals in that they were not the outgrowth of old nature festivals or based upon historic events. In ancient times, there was but one holiday in the fall, the harvest festival. After the exile in Babylonia, this holiday was divided into three distinct holidays but by the time the second Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed, the New Year festival became marked with the same idealism and ceremony that are prevalent today.

Thymus Gland Cause of Infant's Death

Coroner John L. Taylor revealed that the baby died of status lymphaticus (enlargement of the thymus gland), a disease rather prevalent in babies.

Funeral services were held Monday morning from the Seguin and Logan funeral home on N. Second street to St. Patrick's church in West Lake Forest. Burial was in St. Patrick's cemetery.
