the lowest bid amounted to a little over \$500. After further figuring with City Engineer Cole, Mr. Swanson determined that some of the items could be eliminated, thereby bringing the figure below \$500, which would prevent the need of advertising for bids, thus eliminating further delay in finishing the job.

A discussion arose as to the placing of a new water main on Hawthorne lane and as to whether the cost should be charged against the property owners or paid by the city. If the property owners took care of the matter and had a private contractor do the work, the cost has been estimated at about \$1,200. If the city handled the job and was obliged to spend a special assessment the cost would be around \$1,800. The matter was referred to the corporation counsel for investigation, with plans for a future meeting between the city council and Hawthorne Lane property owners.

Mr. Swanson submitted a plan for doing away with the bottle neck on Sheridan road, just north of Central, at a cost of around \$2,000. The matter was tabled for future discussion.

Mr. Bowes reported on the sign situation in Highland Park. He stated that only "for sale" or "for rent" signs are allowed in the residential sections. Other signs are allowed elsewhere by permit only. Investigation disclosed that only 77 permits have been issued, yet there are several times that number of signs in the city. He suggested that permits and licenses be handled by the department of accounts and finances. This suggestion met with the approval of the council. A check will soon be made on the signs to determine whether permits have been issued and those illegally placed will be removed.

The next scheduled meeting of the city council is Monday evening, Sept. 18.

**Lake Forest Police Get Radio Call, And Man—In 11 Minutes**

Working their well known "double-play" radio system, Lake Forest police intercepted a call relayed through Racine from Milwaukee, and put the tag on a fugitive Milwaukeean last Thursday night—all in exactly 11 minutes.

Cruising in his radio equipped police car, Sgt. Earl Dunn of the Lake Forest department received a request from Racine police to be on the lookout for George McGary, 18, Milwaukee negro believed riding in a bus. The call came in at 9:47 Thursday evening.

Dunn sped out along Skokie road, intercepted a southbound bus 11 minutes later and removed the fugitive who admitted his identity. He was wanted on an assault charge in which a woman, believed to be a member of his family, was named.

Milwaukee police dropped into the Lake Forest station at 1:30 a.m. Friday, complimented the local officers on their work and gave McGary a ride back to Wisconsin.
