NEWS AND NOTES

With school now under way the Girl Scouts will be swinging into another busy and worthwhile year. Girl Scouts who have returned from camp have many new ideas for projects to work on this coming year.

At the World's Fair Chalet, the Girl Scout Center, the Omaha, Nebraska, Girl Scouts had one of the most outstanding exhibits. There were many fine projects that could be worked into the Highland Park Girl Scout program. There were some stunning photographs of Omaha Mariners which were taken, developed and enlarged by Girl Scouts. There were ribbon bookmarks, and dainty and amusing invitations and party favors. There were good looking sports clothes, lounging robes, aprons and other garments made by the scouts. There were paper dolls with complete wardrobes designed by the girls. The thing that made this particular entry worthy of comment is the fact that each paper doll represents the girl who designed the costumes for it, and the wardrobe was created for her own particular type, style and interests. The results reflect a great variety of interests—what with ski suits and skating suits; sports clothes for daytime and simple but smart frocks for evening; swim suits and tennis dresses. They also reflect excellent taste on the part of these youthful designers, who had remembered that short girls should not wear dresses too long and tall girls should not wear dresses too short. Novel and most attractive were the invitations to an Easter party, and the place cards. The invitations were written on paper bonnets. The favors carried out the Easter bonnet idea—with smart little hats perched on tiny stands made of gilded meat skewers fitted into gilded wooden button-molds and fastened to the cards. Other entries included in this offering from Omaha were bookends and spice balls; a dark blue Mariner duffle bag and a good looking Mariner chart; a beautifully made woolen plate and a collection of international dolls and stands, made of wood, and several fascinating scrapbooks made by the Girl Scouts. The books on interior decoration and architecture show real interest and understanding of these subjects.

Yom Kippur Day to Be Solemnized at N. S. Church Sept. 23

Richard J. Lyons Takes to Highways on Speaking Tour

Once again a shiny white trailer will take to the highways of Illinois to further the candidacy of an aspirant for high state office. Richard J. Lyons, who met with such remarkable success in his recent trailer campaign as the Republican party's nominee for United States Senator, has just been presented with the modern streamlined trailer, pictured above, as a headquarters for his governorship race, by his home, Lake county, Republican organization.

The trailer, the last word in design and construction, is fully equipped with the most modern improvements. Measuring 26 feet in length, and of full road width, this model is four feet longer than the one used last year which caused so much excitement in Illinois' turbulent political picture. Painted a bright white, it is covered with slogans in red and blue. A speaking platform with hand railings, which telescope in when not in use, is built on top.

The finest public address system available has been installed in the trailer and four horns will broadcast the speeches of the dynamic Libertyville candidate. This traveling headquarters will be independent of public utility power as it travels through the Prairie State, because its own electricity generating plant will provide it with current to operate the loudspeakers and floodlights.

A Mercury coupe will pull the trailer.

Lyons is planning to install a two way short wave radio telephone system in the trailer and one in his permanent campaign headquarters, so that he can be in constant touch with developments in the campaign.

In accepting the trailer from William Marks, chairman of the Lake County Republican Central committee, Lyons said, "It is with deep gratitude that I accept this beautiful traveling headquarters. Believe me, I appreciate that it is the most modern thing on wheels. I thank you for your kind remarks about my being the pioneer in this mode of campaigning and I promise you that I'll blaze a trail throughout this great state which will make you proud of your candidate. I plan to devote all of my time from now until November of 1940 to campaigning for the Governorship. Every hamlet, and every city, will have an opportunity to hear the platform and principles I base my candidacy on. My street corner speeches in Chicago, in the 1938 campaign, have caused the leaders there to schedule me for a series of these addresses again for this coming primary."

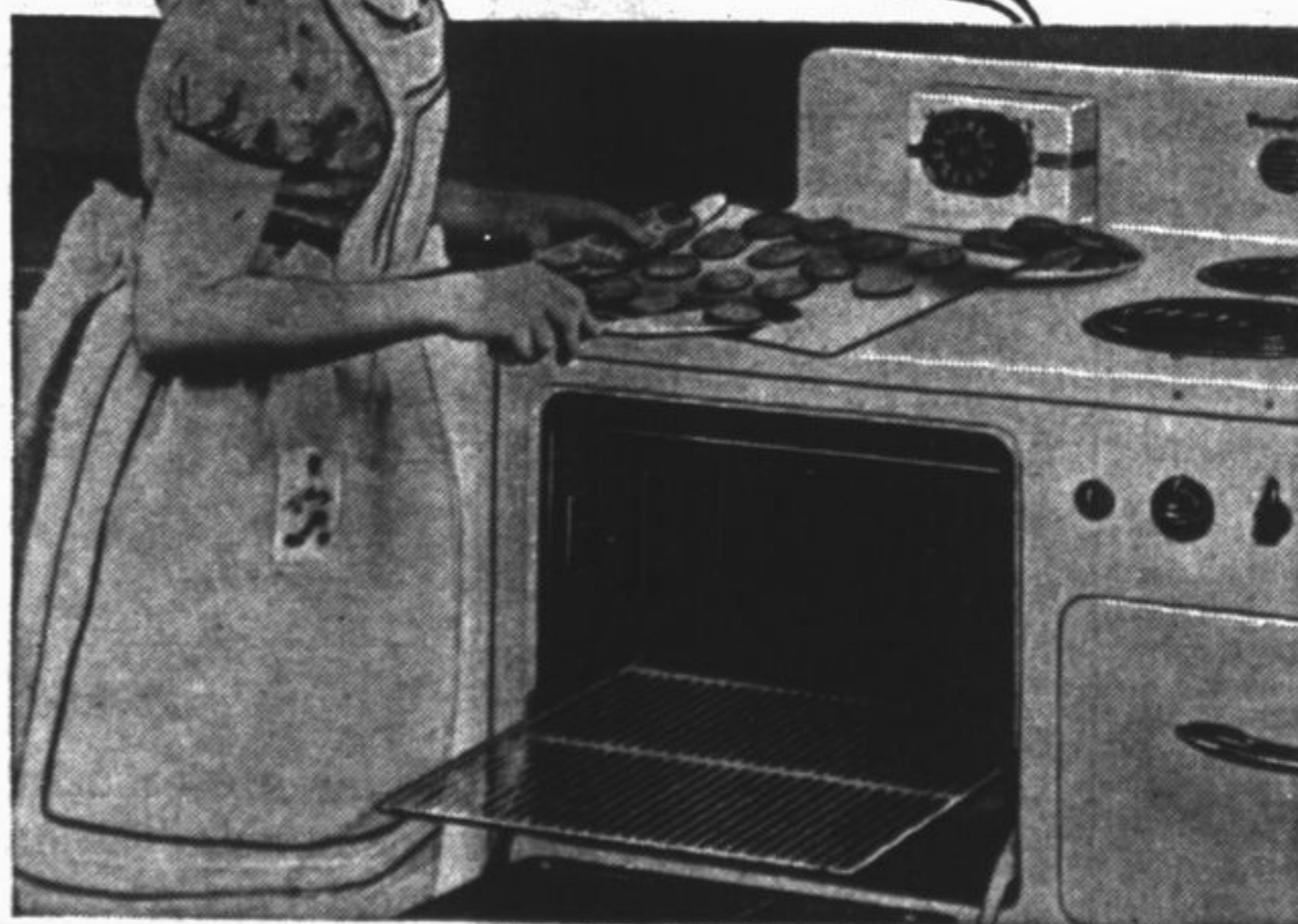
