Local Riflemen Help Illinois to Defeat Wisconsin

The annual small bore interstate rifle match between Wisconsin and Illinois was fired Sunday, Sept. 10, with the Illinois team winning by a margin of 61 points.

The Sherida Rifle and Pistol Club of Highland Park was represented on the Illinois team of 25 men by Robert Spahr, Anthony Biagi and Edwin Cole, who won their places on the team in a tryout match fired Sunday morning. Robert Spahr was high man among the Sheridan club members participating.

A selected group of 70 small bore experts from all parts of the state were invited by the Illinois State Rifle Association to participate in this tryout. John Sobey, of the Sheridan club, was among those selected but, after being inactive for several months, was unable to

perform up to his early season record.

The variable and gusty winds combined with the brilliant sunlight to produce the very tricky conditions for which the Fort Sheridan range is noted. The scores of all shooters, and particularly those of the invading team who seemed less able to cope with the conditions, were lower than in former and more favorable years.

Other North Shore members of the Illinois team were Wallace H. Davis of Highland Park and Mrs. Martin Phelan of Winnetka. Dr. George Postels of the Sheridan club, although not participating in the match fired, simultaneously, a higher score than many of the match shooters. This was his first outdoor activity of the season and he was therefore ineligible for any team activity.

Nineteen hundred thirty-nine is the third straight year in which the Wisconsin team has been so defeated.

Deerfield Worker Killed; Second Fatality in 2 Weeks

A verdict of accidental death was returned in Highland Park Saturday afternoon at an inquest into the fatal injury of Joseph Machak, 32, employed on a Milwaukee railroad construction project, who was struck by a Milwaukee train near Deerfield sometime early Saturday.

Machak was last seen alive around 1 a.m. near the car camp a half mile south of Deerfield station. Six hours later his broken body was found by fellow workers along the right-of-way. He had been killed instantly by a train.

He was unmarried and lived with a sister in Chicago. This is the second man in this crew to have been hit by a train in the past two weeks in Deerfield.
