AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PARK BONDS OF THE PARK DISTRICT OF HIGHLAND PARK IN THE SUM OF THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$30,000.00) AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

WHEREAS, THE PARK DISTRICT OF HIGHLAND PARK is a duly organized Park District under the laws of the State of Illinois, and is charged with the duty of acquiring and maintaining a public park or parks in said district; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the purpose of providing funds for the erection of a field house in Sunset Woods Park, for building, maintaining and protecting the same, and for building, maintaining, and protecting tennis courts in Sunset Woods Park, and for maintaining, improving, and protecting the following named parks, to-wit: Sunset Valley Golf Course, Sunset Woods Park, Central Park, Laurel Park, Lincoln Park, and West Longview Park, by providing additional landscaping, recreational facilities and permanent improvements thereto, and for the payment of the expenses incident thereto, according to plans and specifications on file in the office of the Secretary; that there be borrowed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) and that bonds be issued therefor;

NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of providing funds for the purposes aforesaid, Be It Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Park District of Highland Park of Lake County, Illinois, that there shall be and there are hereby directed to be issued Thirty (30) Park Bonds of this District of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, to be dated September 25, 1939, and bearing interest at the rate of Two and Three-fourths Per Cent (2-3/4%), payable semi-annually, such interest to be evidenced by interest notes or coupons attached to said bonds, respectively.

Said bonds shall be numbered from One (1) to Thirty (30), respectively, and shall mature as follows:

11 to 20, inclusive	September 25, 1946
21 to 30, inclusive	September 25, 1948

and shall be in the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the First National Bank of Highland Park, Illinois, and shall be signed by the President and Treasurer of the Board of Commissioners of this Park District and countersigned by its Secretary with her seal.

SECTION 2. Except as to number, said bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the following form:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the Park District of Highland Park, in the County of Lake, and State of Illinois, a duly organized district, legal entity and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois, acknowledges itself to owe, and for value received hereby promises to pay, to the bearer of this bond, if registered, to the registered holder hereof, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) lawful money of the United States, on the 25th day of September, 1944, with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of Two and Three-fourths Per Cent (2-3/4%) per annum, payable March 25, 1940, and semi-annually thereafter on the 25th day of September and March in each year on presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond shall be payable at the First National Bank of Highland Park, Highland Park, Illinois.

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like date, tenor, and maturity, issued for the purpose of providing funds for the erection of a field house in Sunset Woods Park, for building, maintaining, and protecting the same, and for building, maintaining, and protecting tennis courts in Sunset Woods Park, and for maintaining, improving, and protecting the following named parks, to-wit: Sunset Valley Golf Course, Sunset Woods Park, Central Park, Laurel Park, Lincoln Park, and West Longview Park, by providing additional landscaping, recreational facilities and permanent improvements thereto, and for the payment of the expenses incident thereto, according to plans and specifications on file in the office of the Secretary, in and for said District under the authority of an Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois entitled, "An Act to provide for the organization of park districts and the transfer of submerged lands to those bordering on navigable bodies of water," approved June 24, 1895, and the several amendments thereof.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the organization of the Park District of Highland Park and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form and season as required by law; that a countersignation of this bond has been levied upon all the taxable property in the said Park District of Highland Park for the payment of the principal and interest of this bond; that the total indebtedness of the said Park District of Highland Park, this bond included, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitations. For the prompt payment of this bond, aforesaid, the full faith, credit, and resources of said Park District are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This bond is subject to registration as to principal in the name of the holder upon the books of the Treasurer of said Park District, such registration to be evidenced by the registration shall have Highland Park of. After such registration, no transfer hereof, except upon such books and similarly noted hereon, shall be valid unless the registration shall have been transferred to the holder of this bond, which shall continue transferable by delivery merely by the registration of this bond.

Booking Changes Cause Program Shift in North Shore Series

Unavoidable changes in booking arrangements of nationally-known artists will necessitate a shift in program dates for the North Shore Series, it was announced this week. Because the outbreak of the war found many stars stranded in Europe, schedules for artists already in this country as well as those expected to arrive here have unavoidably been rearranged.

As a result of this general rearrangement the schedule for the Highland Park series has been altered as follows: the first concert of the series will be presented on November 22, and will feature Herta Glatz, contralto star of the Chicago City Opera. Fritz Kreisler, violinist, instead of appearing in October as originally scheduled, will play on December 12. Donald Dickson, young baritone star of the Chase and Sanborn hour, will appear on January 22. Argentinita and her Spanish dancers will come to Highland Park on February 14, and the series will close with Artur Rubinstein, pianist, on April 2, as originally announced.

The committee wishes to point out that in spite of the shift in dates all artists will appear during the season, and that no part of the winter's program has been omitted. It is hoped that the change in dates will not cause inconvenience and will make possible the attendance of those for whom an earlier date would have been difficult.
