"Reality" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, September 24.

The Golden Text was, "Since the beginning of the world men have not heard, nor perceived by the ear, neither hath the eye seen, O God, beside thee, what he hath prepared for him that waiteth for him" (Isaiah 64:4).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And I know that, whatsoever God doeth, it shall be for ever; nothing can be put to it, nor anything taken from it: and God doeth it, that men should fear before him. That which hath been is now; and that which is to be hath already been; and God requireth that which is past" (Ecclesiastes 3:14, 15).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "The three great verities of Spirit, omnipotence, omni-presence, omniscience.—Spirit possessing all power, filling all space, constituting all Science.—contradict forever the belief that matter can be actual" (pp. 109-110).

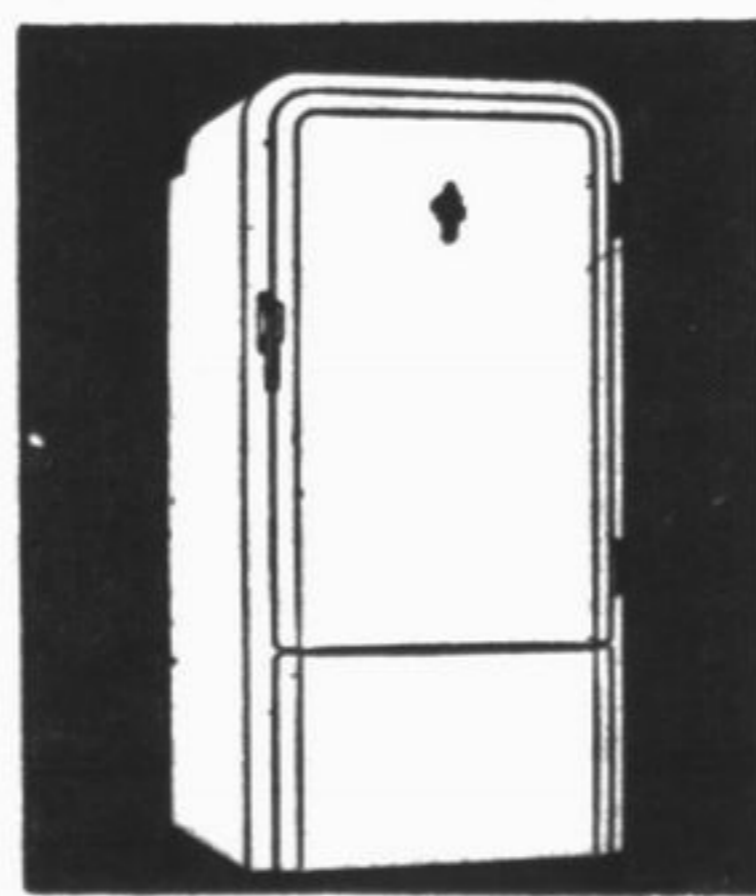
