Removal of Speed Signs From Skokie Provokes Protest

A protest against the removal of speed limit signs and the changing of city limit markers on Skokie highway was made to C. H. Apple, district engineer of the state highway department, last Friday, when he visited the city officials here.

It is claimed that the Skokie highway is a super-highway, and under this title, should have no direct restrictions. In other words, "the sky's the limit" with speed makers removed with the exception of possibly one-half mile within the city or village limits.

Although this does not change the law regarding speeding within the city limits it does however make the situation most hazardous for motorists who attempt to cross the highway at other intersections than those governed by said restriction.

Lake Forest officials have also protested to the state department, and it is hoped that an agreeable adjustment of the situation will soon be made.

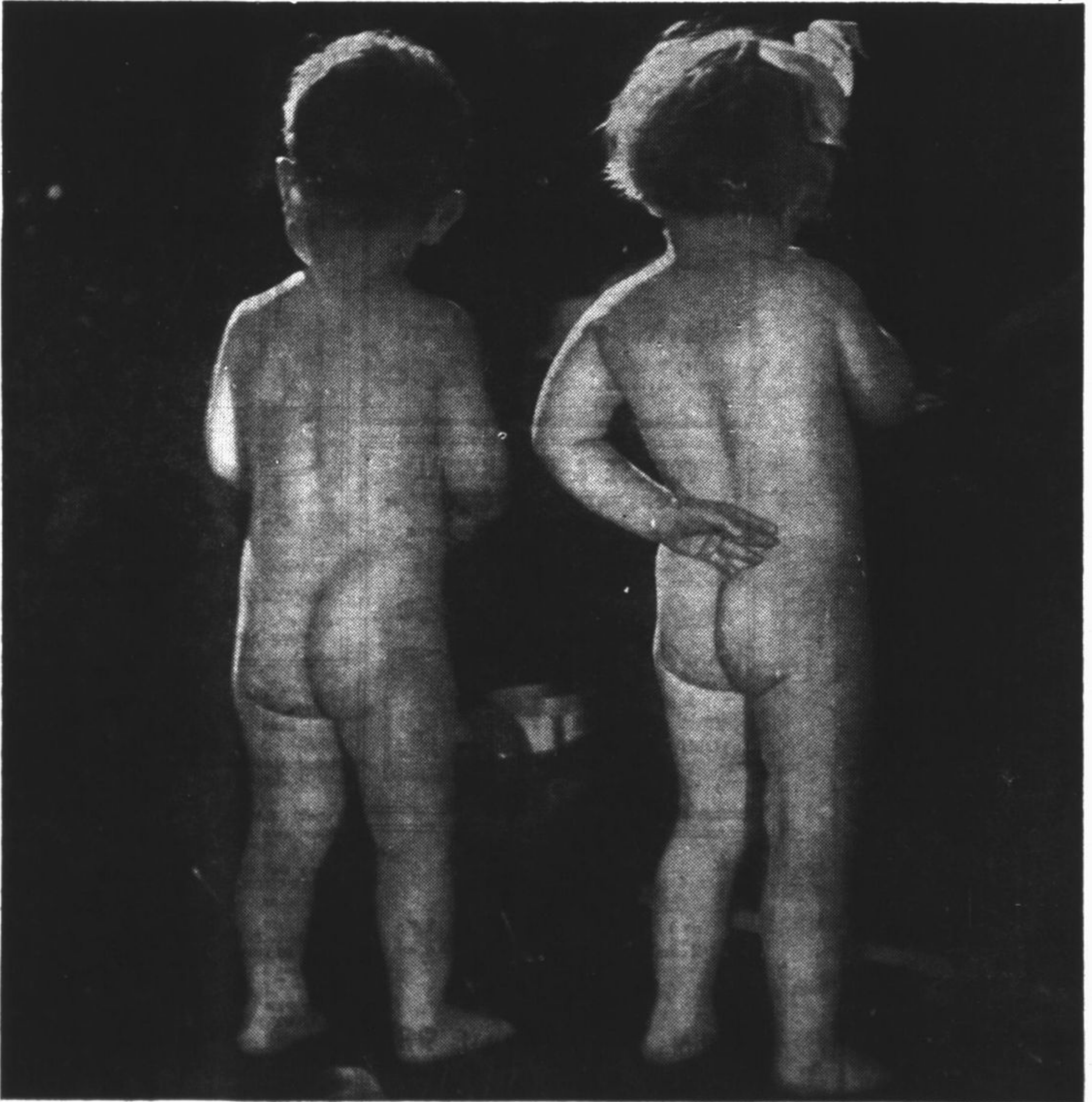
