George Quinn, Highwood Resident, to Be Buried Today

George T. Quinn, 33 North Ave., Highwood, passed away Monday at the Highland Park hospital. Mr. Quinn had been a resident of Highwood for 30 years. He was born in Philadelphia May 17, 1884.

He served with the United States Army in Cuba from 1907-1909 and in Mexico from 1914 to 1918.

For 25 years he was employed as a motorman on the North Shore line and operated the Mundelein special during the Eucharistic Congress of 1926.

Besides his wife Mary, Mr. Quinn is survived by five daughters, Mrs. Georgiana Van Es, Margaret Mary, Dianne, Mary Lois and Theresa K., and two sons, William J. and George T. Jr., all of Highwood.

Funeral services will be held this morning at 9 o'clock at the family residence to St. James church, Highwood. Interment will be in Ascension cemetery.

Three Are Hurt in Highwood Crash

Three persons were hurt early Sunday morning when a Plymouth coupe driving south on Waukegan avenue by Joe Kolar, 929 Wadsworth avenue, Waukegan, crashed into the left side of a Buick sedan driven by Fritz Cox of Washington avenue, Highwood. Both cars were badly damaged. Kolar was charged with driving at excessive speed by the Highwood police.

After the Kolar car hit the Cox car, it veered across the sidewalk and went about 90 feet through the Fort Sheridan reservation fence. Kolar admitted he was driving about 40 miles an hour to Police Chief de Smidt.

Robert Hatch of Waukegan and Doris Torro of Winnetka, who were riding with Kolar, and Mrs. Cox, who was riding with her husband, were the injured. Hatch received an eye cut and bruises, while Miss Turro had a nasal laceration and several loose teeth.

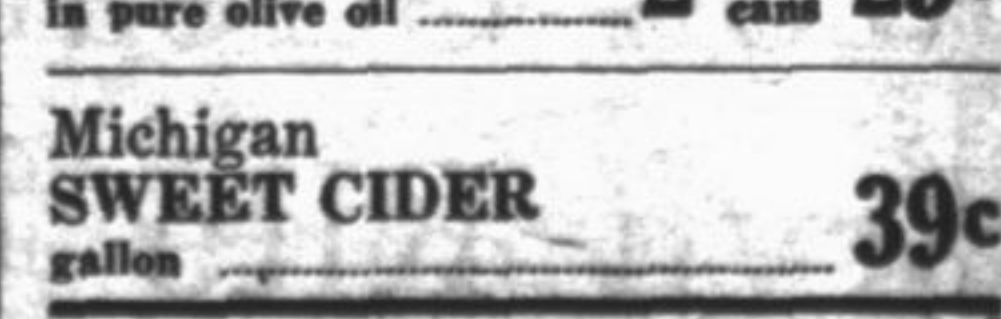
