Walbridge Interview

Hostess, teacher, housekeeper, clubwoman, secretary, and counselor, all rolled into one efficient package is the only way to describe Miss Ruth Walbridge, general secretary of the Highland Park Y.W.C.A. And if you throw in a little interior decorating and plumbing on an occasion, you'll have it down pat.

It all sounds like a big order, and it is. But Miss Walbridge definitely fills the bill. Recently appointed local general secretary, she's able to take everything in her stride because of her varied and worthwhile background.

A graduate of MacMurray college at Jacksonville, Ill., where she majored in psychology, she was picked as a senior among 14 persons from schools throughout the country to attend a Michigan institute on social work sponsored by the Children's Aid society. Miss Walbridge has done work at the University of Wisconsin, studied at the New York School of Applied Arts, and also carried out independent study on Mexican art in Mexico.

She first became interested in "Y" work in college, and her first position was as registrar of the health education department of the McCormick Y.W.C.A. in Chicago, her native city. She was there 18 months, and, along with other duties, she taught swimming.

While in the personnel department of the Central Y college, she specialized in work with young business girls, and it is this work from which stems her particular interest in the business and professional women's groups. Following out the suggestions outlined by the Highland Park Community Service in a survey made last year, she hopes to see individualized counseling become a part of the "Y" program. A well-rounded recreational program and activities for mixed and young married groups are other objectives she'd like to see materialize.

Clubwork, she admits, is probably the most interesting art of Y work, because she meets with personalities that are different but which are alike in one respect—their friendly and appreciative attitudes. An atmosphere prevails, she avers, that is the antithesis of the cold and too often "cut-throat" world of business.

In what little leisure time she has, Miss Walbridge turns to interior decorating, dress designing, and swimming for recreation. Since her father was a civil engineer, she has traveled quite a bit, having seen every state east of Kansas and lived for varied lengths of time in Florida, Illinois, and other sections of Illinois. But she is not altogether a stranger to Highland Park, as she was graduated from Highland Park high school, (then Deerfield-Shields). For the past 16 years, she has lived off and on in Lake Bluff, her present address being 650 Sunrise avenue in that city.

Miss Walbridge's assistants are Ruth Scott, girls' secretary, in charge of the nursery, dramatics, and the younger girls' club, and Gertrude Ames, house secretary for the past nine years.
