Important changes of the ministry in two parishes of Libertyville Mundelein took place last week. The Rev. Stockton M. Swaney for five years pastor of the Libertyville Methodist church, was moved to a larger Chicago parish.

The Rev. C. Arthur Jevne, who has been pastor of the two congregational churches in Mundelein and Ivanhoe turned in his resignation as pastor of the Mundelein church, Sunday. Mr. Jevne's resignation climaxed a service in Mundelein of 16 years.

R. M. Lodbell, Lake county superintendent of highways for the past 13 years, was reappointed Tuesday by the county board. The appointment is for six years.

Mr. Smith said that his committee is planning a lively entertainment that will attract children of all ages and their parents.
