

New Trier Sunday Evening Club to Hear Dr. Preston Bradley

The New Trier Sunday Evening club opens its 26th year Sunday evening, November 5 at 8 o'clock in the New Trier school auditorium, Winnetka.

The opening speaker, this year as last year is Dr. Preston Bradley, pastor of the People's church, Chicago for 27 years. The subject will be "What America Can Do Now."

Dr. Bradley is nationally famous as a preacher, an orator and an author. Among the books he has written are: "Courage for Today," "Mastery of Fear," and "Power from Right Thinking."

Dr. Bradley is also past president of the Isaac Walton League of America, a member of the board of directors of the Chicago Public Library and a member of the Normal School board of the State of Illinois.

Dr. Bradley's audience is over 1,000 people each Sunday morning. He also has a large radio audience over WJJD, his Sunday morning sermon being broadcast over this station. People's church was dedicated October 10, 1926. The building cost \$750,000.

Dr. Bradley has many friends on the North Shore who will look forward to hearing him at the opening of the New Trier Sunday Evening club.

N. Y. Philharmonic Orchestra in Benefit Concert November 28

The Children's Memorial Hospital was founded in Chicago in 1884 by Mrs. Julia F. Porter in memory of her son, Maurice Porter.
