### Inklings from Neighboring Towns

Thanksgiving morning will see the congregations of four of Glencoe's churches gathered together for a Union Thanksgiving service. The union service, which is a Glencoe tradition, will this year be held at the North Shore Congregation Israel, Lincoln and Vernon avenues, at 10:30 o'clock on Thursday morning, November 23.

Parents' visiting Night was held at Lake Forest high school on Thursday, November 9, as a part of the national celebration of American Education Week.

Parents of students and friends of the school were invited to visit the school, become acquainted with members of the faculty, and discuss the problems of their children with the teachers.

Following the recent order of the Illinois Commerce Commission requiring the two railroads to install automatic gates at the Harbor street crossing in Wilmette, the railroads

Speaking before 300 members of Christ Episcopal church and their guests, including 40 city and county officials and public leaders in Waukegan at the Parish house recently, Bishop George Craig Stewart, head of the Chicago diocese of the Episcopal church, called for a closer unity between church people as opposed to foreign ideologies which deny any religion whatever. The occasion was the ninety-third annual parish banquet.

"What we need is the visible unity of all churches," said Bishop Stewart.

"We are not satisfied with mere tolerance. To Jews and Christians alike, tolerance is not enough. We do not merely want to tolerate the Jews nor have the Jews merely tolerate us. We want real fellowship.

"We have the same God. We follow much of the same tenets and we have similar methods of attaining the same goal. The Christian church is Jewish and we have been allowed to come in."
