"Mortals and Immortals" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, November 12.

The Golden Text was, "Henceforth know me no man after the flesh" (II Corinthians 5:16).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "As for man, his days are as grass: as a flower of the field, so he flourisheth. For the wind passeth over it, and it is gone; and the place thereof shall know it no more. But the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children" (Psalms 103:15-17).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Immortal man was and is God's image or idea, even the infinite expression of infinite Mind, and immortal man is coexistent and co-eternal with that Mind. He has been forever in the eternal Mind. God; but infinite Mind can never be in man, but is reflected by man. The spiritual man's consciousness and individuality are reflections of God" (p. 336).
