This questionnaire was put to Helen Gibertini, 427 Funston avenue, Highwood, who is a freshman at Barat College of the Sacred Heart in Lake Forest. Barat is a full-fledged four-year college (since 1919) with a restricted registration. It is named for Madeleine Sophie Barat, founder of the Order of the Sacred Heart in 1800, who established it for the education of the French nobility. Twenty-two are on the faculty, half nuns and half laymen, to give individual emphasis. The grades and high school classes are held at Barat, too.

Q. What is the usual costume on the Barat campus?
A. A beige tweed suit is the required uniform worn usually with a beige sweater or a tan shirt. There is also a dinner uniform, a two-piece dress, worn after tea and following classes.

Q. Any dress fads?
A. Knee-top woolen socks are the go now.

Q. What are some of the traditional events observed during the school year?
A. The Reverend Mothers' Feast is a formal occasion celebrating the founding of the Order of the Sacred Heart, on Nov. 21. College students appear in cap and gown, the academy sports white uniforms, and the grades similar white garb.

The first Friday of the month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart, when Holy Mass is said following a Holy Hour on Thursday in preparation for the benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Q. Are most of the girls resident students?
A. Of about 104 in the college, 10 live at home.

Q. What outside activities are the favorite indulgences?
A. Tea dances, beach picnics, pancake roasts, hikes, and horseback riding.

Q. What sports reign at Barat?
A. Horseback riding is first. Hockey, volleyball, swimming, and basketball are popular.

Q. What is your course of study?
A. Humanities, philosophy, logic,

religion, Latin, biology, French, English, speech. A freshman's course is outlined for her. I carry 23 hours.

Q. What do you plan to do?
A. I want to teach languages in high school.

Q. Where do most of the girls come from?
A. Most are from Chicago and the North Shore, with two from Canada, two from South America, and one from Mexico.

Q. What are the popular courses?
A. Art and languages.

Q. In general, how is the school conducted?
A. All according to French cultural traditions.
