Inc. petitioned the council to extend the time limit for bids on the old City hall property another sixty days in order to allow them more time for the investigation of credentials of prospective buyers. The council voted to take the Community Service bid under advisement for the time being, and tabled final action on the disposal of the property until a later date.

In his report, the mayor announced the appointment of James D. Berube and Earl Lemkinen to the Police Department to fill the vacancies left by the resignation of Thomas Rafferty and the retirement of Dennis Driscoll. The mayor paid tribute to the latter two men and said their work provided excellent examples for the younger men on the force to follow. In regard to the appointments of Berube and Lemkinen, Mayor Ronan stated that these two men stood highest on the civil service list and would be placed on probation for a six months period following which time they would be permanently added to the force if their work came up to the Police Department's standards.

The City Clerk announced that easements in the Driscoll Court water main extension petition had been granted by property owners involved and recommended that permission for the extension be granted. The council so voted.

Commissioner Swanson said that inasmuch as many of the local citizenry were failing to cooperate with the city in the removal of hedges and other obstructions which added to motoring hazards, his department was going to take the matter in its own hands and do it itself.

Commissioner Sharp recommended that a preliminary survey be made by the water department to find ways and means of improving water pressure in the southeast part of the city during summer months and report the cost thereof to the council. He also suggested that the City Engineer make a survey on paving Green Bay road south of Central Avenue.

Commissioner Sharp also called attention to the meeting scheduled on Thursday night at which the various tax bodies of the community will gather and discuss further steps to be taken toward clearing up the local delinquent tax situation on real estate property.

**Held to Grand Jury**  
**For Theft of Coat**

Two Fort Sheridan soldiers, charged with larceny after admitting the theft of an overcoat, were bound over to the grand jury Monday on a \$2,000 bond each by Police Magistrate Joseph Ariano of Highwood. Unable to furnish bond, the two men were placed in the county jail.

Richard W. Vandergriff, 25, and Elmo Haywood, 27, were seized Saturday night in My Favorite Inn, Highwood, where they were attempting to sell a \$40 overcoat belonging to Angelo Santi, 429 Oakwood Avenue, which they had taken from a radiator in the Lido tavern. Santi and two companions grabbed the thieves and turned them over to Highwood police who were on duty near the tavern.

Both young men have criminal records, which were not known when they enlisted. Vandergriff, who comes from Pennington, Va., enlisted at Fort Thomas, Ky., Oct. 1, 1939, and Haywood, whose home is in May, Conn., enlisted at Fort Hayes, Ohio, Oct. 24, 1939.

**Fires Sweep Trees from Early Fields**

Many of the early fields in Illinois presented a "dismal appearance," according to an account written in 1819. A traveler of the time observed that frequently settlers cleared the ground by grubbing up small trees only. Large ones were either cut down to within three feet of the ground or merely "chopped around the stems," and a small strip of bark peeled off. Decay then was left to take its course and the land owners were saved the trouble of cutting down the trees.

When underbrush, roots and smaller trees were burned where they lay, the fire often spread to the larger standing trees, says the Illinois Writers' Project, W.P.A. In some areas, a visitor could commonly see about one hundred half-burned trees to each eight or ten acres under cultivation.
