**Veteran Employee of North Shore Line Passes on Friday**

A veteran employe of the Chicago, Milwaukee and North Shore railroad, George Merriman, 61, died at his home, 1417 Jenkinson court, Waukegan, at 7:30 a.m. Friday. He had been ill for the past two months.

Born in Wilson, Mr. Merriman had lived in Lake county all his life.

On June 22, 1898, he went to work for the North Shore Line. His first regular assignment was as motorman on the Fort Sheridan-Highland Park run. In nine hours of working time he made 10 round trips. In 1916, he was made trainmaster on the shoreline route between Waukegan and Evanston.

Surviving are the widow, Elsie; son, Donald Merriman, well known Waukegan athlete; daughter, Mrs. Robert E. Neeham, and two grandchildren.

Services were held from the home on Monday to the Immaculate Conception church, Waukegan, at 10 a.m. Burial was in St. Mary's cemetery.

**Social Security Offices Observe Holiday Closing**

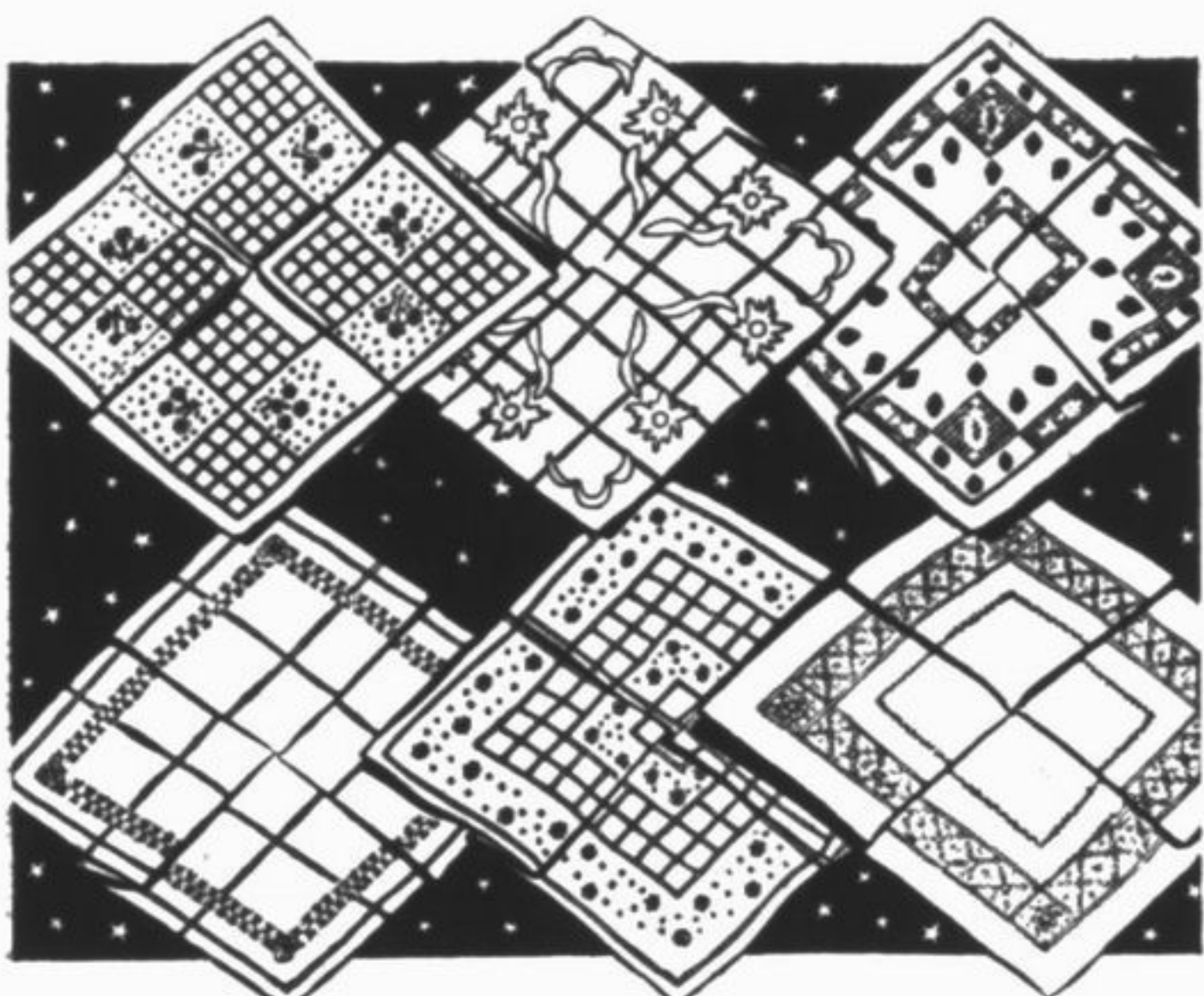

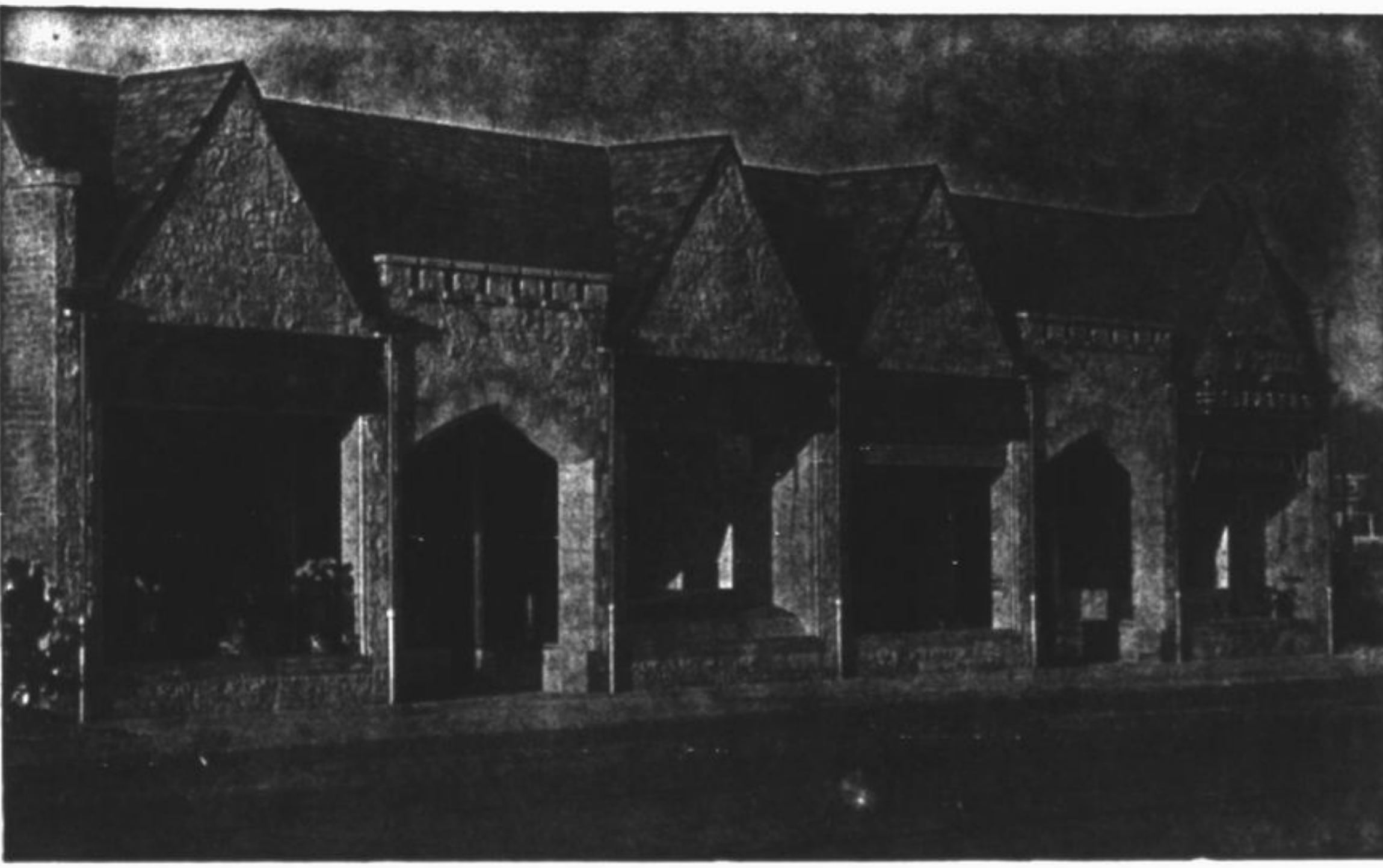
