Seven Deerfield Families to Get Insurance Payments

The Social Security Board Field Office at Waukegan, Ill., has notified seven Deerfield residents that they may be eligible to receive monthly payments under the Old-Age and Survivors Insurance program of the Social Security Act, beginning January 1, 1940, according to a statement made today by Albert S. Lewis, manager of the Waukegan field office.

Mr. Lewis also stated that it is advisable for all wage earners 65 years of age or over who have secured six calendar quarters of employment after December 1936 in jobs covered by the provisions of the

Social Security Act and who have become unemployed or contemplate retiring, to contact an office of the Board to familiarize themselves with the requirements necessary to become entitled to old-age and survivors insurance benefits.

The amendments to the Social Security Act provide that survivors of workers may be entitled to monthly payments where death of the wage earner occurs after December 31, 1939. Payments may also be made to an eligible worker's wife if she is age 65 or more. Mr. Lewis stated that detailed information may be obtained by calling or writing to the Waukegan field office, Room 4, Post Office building.

Lake Forest Plans to Improve and Add to City Property

While no official announcement has been made, Lake Forest city officials are dealing on the purchase of four and one-half acres of land from the Louis F. Swift estate. This property will be used to enlarge the present city yards to provide adequate space for expansion. Plans are now being made to coordinate work of all departments and when these plans are completed all materials and equipment will be stored in the enlarged yards. Tentative plans include the building of a railroad switch at some future time.

Purchase price of the property has been placed at \$15,000 and \$5,000 will be paid on completion of the deal, with the balance to be paid in two annual installments of \$5,000 each. The money will come from the income of the city water department. The property adjoins the present yards, and parts face on both Western and Laurel avenues.

Bids on the remodeling of the city hall and the clubhouse at Deerpath Golf Course have been received but not accepted. It was planned to hold a council meeting on Wednesday, December 20, to consider and accept bids, but a quorum was not available. Estimates on the clubhouse reached \$8,500, but if low bids are accepted actual cost will be somewhat less. However, in the case of remodeling the city hall actual costs may run 25 per cent over the estimate which was placed at approximately \$3,000.

Mrs. R. P. Wainwright Passes Away Dec. 19 in Seattle, Wash.

Mrs. Robert P. Page Wainwright, who made her home in Highland Park with her son-in-law, Dr. Daniel W. Rogers, until his death a few years ago, died Tuesday, December 19, in Seattle, Wash. She was the wife of Major Robert Powell Page Wainwright, U. S. Army. After the death of her daughter, Mrs. Wainwright lived with the late Dr. Rogers, and raised his two sons.

She was born in New York, Sept. 29, 1852. She was a member of the Dames of the Loyal Legion, and the American Legion Auxiliary of Dumaresq Spencer Post of this city.

Mrs. Wainwright is survived by a son, Gen. J. M. Wainwright, of Ft. Bliss, Texas, and a daughter, Mrs. Frederick Mears of Seattle, Wash., a grandson, Robert W. Rogers of Barrington, R. I., and four other grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Interment was at Arlington cemetery, Washington, D. C., Tuesday, December 26.
