For the first time in history, federal and state governments have passed the billion dollar mark in gasoline tax collections for a single year, according to the Chicago Motor club. Tax statistitions estimate that this amount was reached this past December 15, making a total of nine and a half billion dollars paid in gas tax money by motorists in the last twenty years.

District Office of Motor Carriers Is Opened in Elgin

The office of District No. 2, Division of Motor Carriers, comprising Lake, McHenry, Boone, DuPage and Kane counties, has been opened in the building of State Police Headquarters at Dundee and Congden avenue in Elgin, Ill. The men placed in charge are: J. C. Weiland of Aurora, Jack B. Ewing and Joseph L. Mull of Waukegan, and Thomas H. Dwyer of Joliet.

Information and assistance in preparing application blanks, desired by all those owning and operating trucks on the highways of the state to comply with the requirements of the Illinois Truck Act, approved in July, 1939, are now available at this office.

As rapidly as possible, meetings of truck operators will be arranged at convenient points in these various counties, where explanations will be made and forms distributed by one, or other, of these men.

All motor carriers are required to make a choice of their classifications in conformity with their line of operations, which they desire to carry on. By far the larger number of carriers will qualify under a few classes, which can be easily determined by conference with the personnel at the office, or otherwise in the district.

It is particularly desired that truck operators know that there will be no charge whatever made by the district office for information, forms, or other service to them. Inquiries by mail may be addressed to the district office at the address above. Telephone No. Elgin 7026 has been installed.
