H. P. Educators to Attend Progressive Education Meeting

Chicago will play host to a large group of educators from far and near when the Progressive Education association holds its annual conference the week of February 19 to 24. So large a crowd is expected that meetings will be held in two hotels; the Padmer House and the Congress hotel. The conference theme is "Resources and Education." Preceding the actual conference program, three days will be given over to visiting housing projects, museums, schools, and libraries in the area and consideration will be given to all the forces, social, cultural, and religious in the environment that bring their influences to bear upon the development of the child and the youth. Curriculum material will, of course, be considered intensively as always, but this conference is important because it will see far beyond the four walls of the classroom.

Dr. Winters Attends Demonstration of New Iron Lung Tuesday

Representatives from all hospitals in the county were invited to attend a demonstration of the new iron lungs, which have recently been purchased by Lake county residents, in a campaign conducted by the Waukegan News-Sun, Tuesday evening at Abbott Laboratories in North Chicago.

Dr. William L. Winters of this city represented the local hospital, while Dr. A. J. Rissinger of Lake Forest and Dr. Bovik of Waukegan represented hospitals from their vicinity.

It was very apropos that this demonstration should be held on this evening, in view of the fact that it was the President's birthday. President Roosevelt has been instrumental in furthering a campaign to fight infantile paralysis in the United States.

Lake county has been without equipment to take care of infantile paralysis cases, and whenever such condition developed it has been necessary to take patients to some other community outside the county for proper treatment. This has worked a hazard in several cases, and realizing the great need, a com-

mittee in Waukegan was organized, and funds procured to secure the proper equipment.

Two iron lungs have been purchased and after they have been demonstrated throughout the county, it is planned to place one in the Highland Park hospital and the other at the Emergency hospital in Waukegan. Both will be taken to any hospital in the county when needed.

With the aid of state police, the plane was taxied south on Skokie highway to County Line road, where the highway widens, and took off from near the Villa Moderne. As he ascended, he circled three times above the crowd of motorists and spectators, waving his thanks and then headed south.

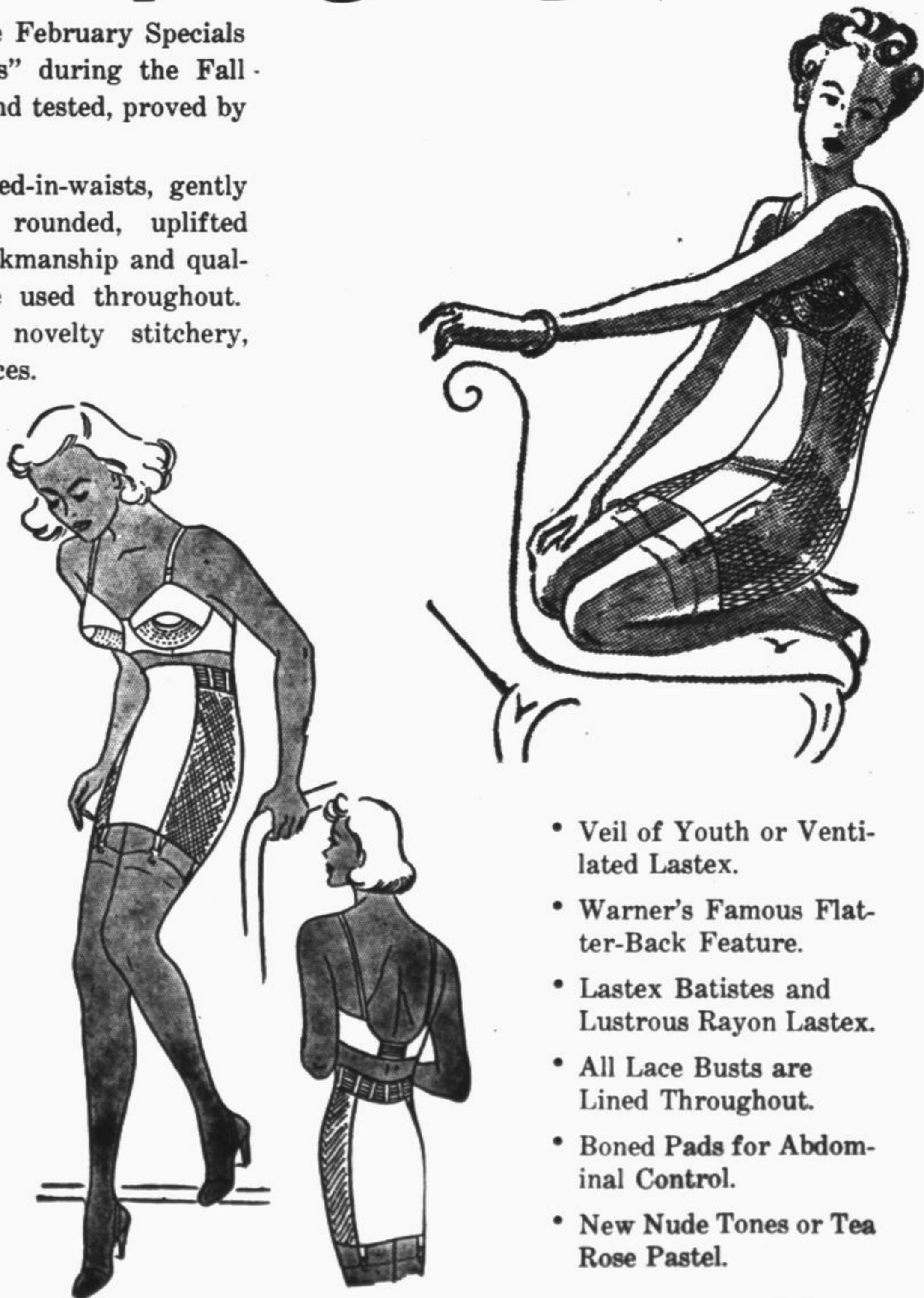
