## "Keep Electricity A Good Servant" Says Miss Ibsen

"Electricity may be the cause but it is seldom the sinner in the case of many a victim that comes to us for repairs," said Miss Marjorie Ibsen, superintendent of the Highland Park hospital. "Electricity like fire, you know, is a wonderful servant but a terrible master. And when someone is badly burned or shocked, nine times out of ten it is the victim's fault. He has misused electricity."

Men, women, and children are tragically careless in handling what has come to be man's greatest servant. To wipe out this carelessness or ignorance about electricity, especially in the home, these simple rules have been made:

1. Don't buy things electrical on a basis of how cheap, but how good. Many cheap electrical devices are dangerous when connected and in
