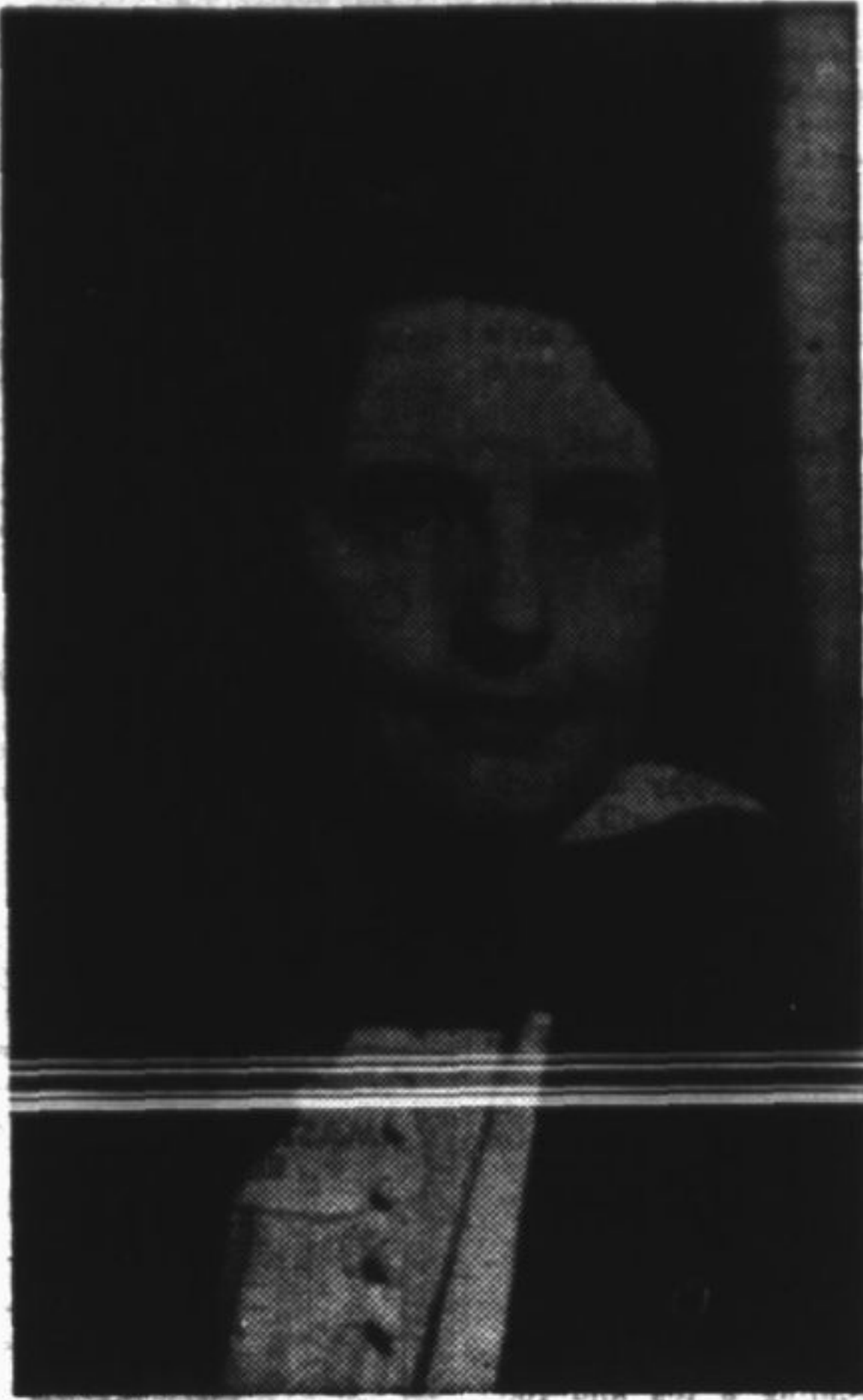


State President Of League Of Women Voters Here March 13

In preparation of the convention of the National League of Women Voters to be held in New York City, April 29-May 3, Mrs. George G. Bogert, president of the Illinois League of Women Voters, will visit the Board of the Highland Park League on March 13 at the home of Mrs. Marc Law. The program of the National League for the ensuing two years will be discussed with the local board. Laboratory work to teach more women to become effective participants in government is the light in which these discussions on the League's proposed program will be held.

"Good citizenship involves not only knowing but knowing how," says Mrs. Bogert. "We shall consider the League's program well in advance of our convention and once having adopted it we shall regard it as a blue print for practical action. Whether or not we are to succeed in preserving democratic government in our country will depend on the proportion of our citizens who are thus interested in government and competent to act. Everyone's a statesman in a democracy."

Mrs. Bogert is visiting local Leagues throughout the State of Illinois in order to discuss the program of the National League prior to its convention.

Mrs. Bogert became active in civic and community affairs in Chicago and Illinois soon after Mr. Bogert assumed a professorship at the University of Chicago Law School in 125.

She served the Hyde Park League

as finance chairman and president; the Cook County League as president, and the Illinois League as publicity chairman. She is a graduate of Adelphi College.

Her family, her Michigan farm and the League keep Mrs. Bogert extremely active and busy.

Highwood Council Approves Waterworks

Monday evening, the Highwood City Council unanimously approved the work of the Leininger Construction Co. of Chicago in building the \$226,000 waterworks system.

With the federal government previously okaying the project, the council's action paves the way for a payment from the FWA to meet the \$2,800 in interest due last Friday.

At the adjourned meeting Monday, bids for materials on the \$24,000 project of widening Highwood and Railway avenues were advertised.

Work will begin early next month. Mayor Charles Portilla won his point in insisting that the labor hired be not reserved for Highwood men only.

"If we refuse to take on workers from other communities," he explained, "Highwood laborers will be discriminated against in outside projects."

James Anderson III of the James Anderson Co. engineering firm of Lake Forest personally asked the council to settle his concern's 12-year-old \$5,000 suit for \$400.

All the aldermen were reported to be in favor of a settlement for that

amount, but Mayor Portilla made further negotiations necessary when he declared that "\$100 is the limit."
