"Man" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, March 11.

The Golden Text was, "O man greatly beloved, fear not; peace be unto thee, be strong, yea, be strong" (Daniel 10: 19).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth" (Genesis 1: 26)

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "The Scriptures inform us that man is made in the image and likeness of God: Man is spiritual and perfect; and because he is spiritual and perfect, he must be so understood in Christian Science" (p. 475)
