Mrs. Stanley Burke has returned from Florida, where she spent most of the winter.

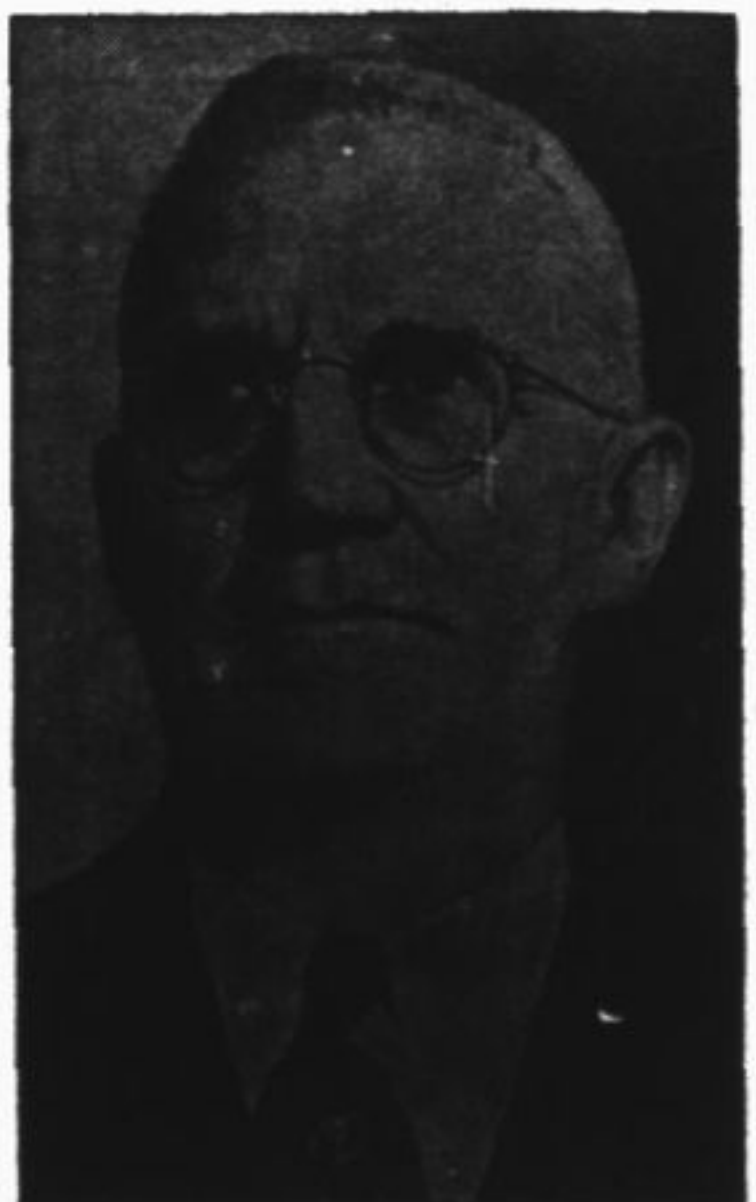

Tillet vs. Schnabel In Bout Friday Sponsored by Moose

Acclaimed by Harvard anthropologists as the closest thing to the prehistoric caveman yet discovered, and recognized as probably the strongest living human in the world today, M. In addition to the sensational wind-up attraction, three additional all-star matches have been signed which feature some of the outstanding names in wrestling. In the semi-windup, Don Lou Theisz, 24 year old

Hungarian giant and holder of the world's heavyweight wrestling championship for three months, will meet Olaf Olson, powerful Swedish heavyweight titleholder.

In the other bouts Jim McMillen, still rated among the top heavyweights in the sport will meet the self styled "missing link" of wrestling, Charlie "Gorilla" Grubmyer. Gruby will give the "Angel" himself competition when "good looks" are considered, and is expected to give McMillen a real match. Hans Kampfer, 230 pound German Adonis, goes against lithe, agile Seeli Samara, sensational colored star.
