Plans are being drawn for a new building at the Lake Forest Day school, to accommodate the present growth of the school, Headmaster Robert T. Hall announced this week.

This new building will be erected to the north and west of the present building. The addition will be a two-story structure of the same general architecture style, using the same kind of materials as the original building.

Tentative plans for the new station of the Chicago, North Shore, and Milwaukee electric railroad company at Hubbard Woods were made public this week.

The proposed Hubbard Woods passenger station of the North Shore line is to be a modern designed building approximately 34 feet, north and south, by 37 1/2 feet, east and west, built directly over the North Shore line tracks on a steel framework located immediately south of the proposed pedestrian bridge extending over both the tracks of the C. & N. W. railway and the C. N. S. & M. R.R. and approximately opposite the south line of Hubbard place.

Direct access is proposed to be had from this pedestrian bridge, thus providing the shortest and most convenient entrance for North Shore patrons residing both east and west of the railroad.

Three hundred members of the Christian Catholic church make the portrayal and in the colorful costumes of the Near East they take their audiences back two thousand years and vividly present the tragic, yet finally triumphant, story of Jesus Christ.

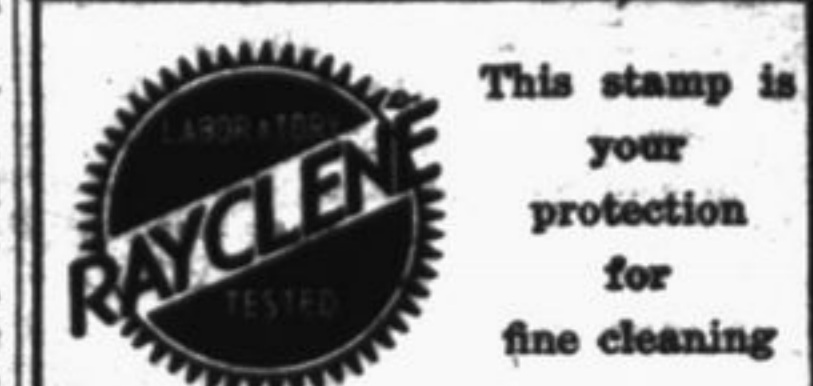
