

Mrs. Francis N. Bard Passes Away Sunday Following Operation

Mrs. Edith Decker Bard died Sunday at Passavant hospital, Chicago, following an operation performed Friday for brain tumor, from which she did not rally.

A resident of Highland Park for the past 28 years, Mrs. Bard had been socially prominent and actively interested in the Community Center, Oesoli club (which is now non-existent), Highland Park Music club, and the Highland Park Presbyterian church.

She was the wife of Francis Norwood Bard, president of the Barco company of Chicago, and mother of Mrs. Joshua Derry of Lake Forest and Edith Marion Bard. She is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Anna M. Decker, of Evanston, and a brother, Leon Morton Decker, of Waterloo, Iowa.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 4 o'clock in Highland Park Presbyterian church. Interment was in Rosehill Mausoleum. The following tribute has been contributed by a friend:

"Edith Bard was loved by all who knew her, family and friends, and by all who served her, tradespeople, from the most important to the humblest, and those in her employ, which is a perfect tribute. She was a patron of all that is worth while in the community and if not actively interested was ever generous. Music was her first interest, outside her family, and as a charter member of the Highland Park Music club, worker on the subscriber's committees of the Chicago Symphony as well as the Ravinia concerts and for fifteen or more years chairman of the Highland Park Presbyterian church, she made a great community contribution. The Bard Memorial chancel, dedicated on April 14, was finally realized as a desire of her heart, and the fine choir which now occupies it every Sunday is the result of months of detailed planning by Mrs. Bard and her committee. All this was done the last few years while in poor health, but few realized it, so cheerfully and bravely did she 'carry on.'

"Edith Bard will be missed and most for her blithe, happy spirit, her kindness and tolerance, her laughter and her song. A great traveler, she has only embarked again, long before her three score years and ten, and we bid her 'Bon Voyage.'

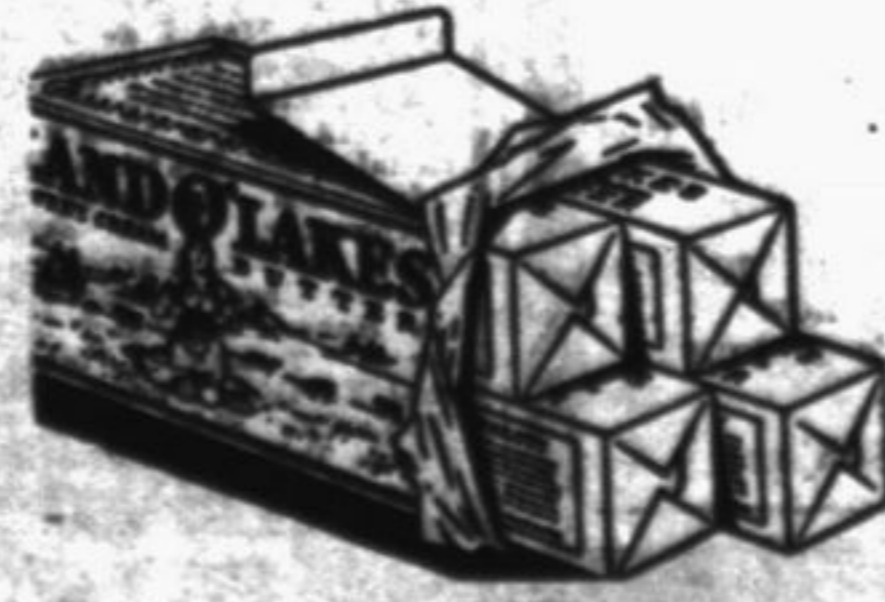
