similar street names must be changed, most of their objections would vanish. The council, upon the recommendation of Commissioner Swanson, voted to hold a special meeting with interested property owners for the purpose of working out some solution to the problem.
 Commissioner Swanson again brought up the subject of the hazard to life and limb caused by improperly placed shrubbery at street intersections. Inasmuch as the property owners in question had failed to pay heed to previous warnings issued by the council, it was his suggestion that the shrubs be removed by the city without further delay. Mayor Ronan stated that the matter would be turned over to the police department for immediate action.
 Commissioner Swanson also called the council's attention to the empty lot in the north end of the city between North avenue and Bloom street that was being used as a dump by nearby residents. He recommended that the Wilmette State bank, holders of the mortgage on the property be advised to have it cleaned up.
