## Town Collector Is Proving Boon To Taxpayers Here

Town Collector Gregory Sheahan has expressed satisfaction over the returns being made on taxes during the past two weeks. A majority of the taxes paid have been in full, while a considerable amount has also been received on back taxes. The deadline of payment is June first, and it is hoped that all real estate owners will respond as rapidly as possible.

In 1920 Town Clerks were ruled out for all counties under 100,000 population, but the rapid growth in the past few years in Lake county has permitted the reinstatement of this office. Thus Highland Park again has a town collector.

Local people have found that this service has proved most beneficial and have expressed sincere appreciation to Gregory Sheahan who is serving his first year in this capacity.

Harry Earhart, local assessor, has cooperated with Mr. Sheahan in making it possible to correct names and descriptions on the tax records. Any questions regarding your taxes will be answered by the Town Collector. Tax books are in the hands of Mr. Sheahan who is located in the First National Bank and may be examined at any time.

Also elected to office in 1937, Mr. Sheahan could not assume his duties until this year, because of complications in the County Clerk's office, through an inadvertent delay with the tax books.

Highland Park is most fortunate in having a man of Mr. Sheahan's experience as Town Collector, for he has been working with J. B. Morse, County Clerk, since 1935 and has a general knowledge of tax laws and general routine tax matters. Fees earned from this office have already covered the expense involved.

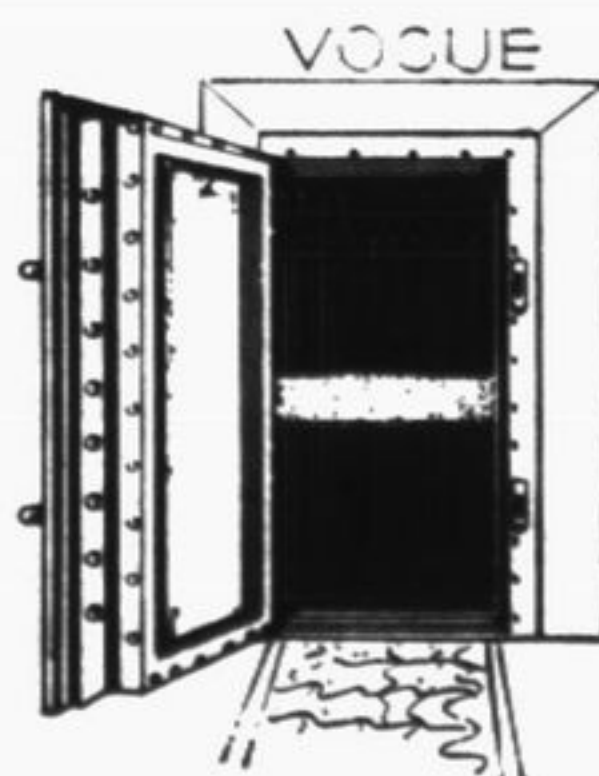
