Synopsis of Lecture On Christian Science

A large audience gathered at the Elm Place school Monday evening to hear a lecture on Christian Science by Florence Middaugh, C.S., of Los Angeles, Calif., member of the Board of Lectureship of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ Scientist, in Boston, Mass.

The speaker discussed the following points in the lecture on Christian Science:

Mankind is faced with problems today that only an understanding of God, Spirit, can solve. The need for spiritual growth instead of material development, is evident in the educational systems of training, as well as in everyday living. Christian Science declares that "the time for thinkers has come" (Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Maker Eddy, Pref., p. vii), and explains that it is spiritual thinking, the unfoldment of right ideas, and not human reasoning, that the world so greatly needs today. Through prejudice or ignorance some may have formed an erroneous conception of the teachings of Christian Science, which are not new, but based entirely upon the Bible, the Christianity taught in both the Old and the New Testament, and specifically upon the ministry and teachings of Jesus.

That God is the only creator, is one of the fundamentals of this teaching; but, further, that this creation consists only of good, that man was made in the image and likeness of God, Spirit, hence o nly good, is substantiated by the Scriptures. Jesus was the Way-shower, who came to show us by demonstrating every step of the way out of materiality into spirituality, that we may do the things he did, and likewise prove our divine sonship with God. The Christ, which he manifested in unlimited degree, is as present with us today as it was with him.

Mary Baker Eddy, the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science, began, as Jesus did, in early youth to ponder and prove the truths contained in the Bible. After being instantaneously healed of the effects of a serious accident, following many years of invalidism, she devoted her life to gaining a demonstrable understanding of the Principle which governed the healings of Jesus, and gave this revelation in a tangible form to the world after years of consecration to this purpose.

Mankind today needs to ask itself, as in the parable of the good Samaritan given by Jesus, "Who is my neighbour?" It is for each one to examine and correct his own thinking towards his neighbor, and gain a scientific, hence a right attitude toward him, before the problems of the world can be solved. Prayer in Christian Science is affirmation, rather than petition—an intent to labor for what we ask, live in accordance with our prayers, asking for good because we believe and

know that good is man's divine heritage, and something from which he can never be separated.

Mortal mind counterfeiting divine Mind, would place limits of every kind upon man, while divine Mind, which is limitless and infinite, breaks these limitations, and pronounces man as perfect as he was created.

Finding the truth, or the right idea that meets the specific need, is only the first step. One must practice and prove it, and make it one's own. One must follow the command of Jesus, who so accurately answered the lawyer's question as to what he should do to inherit eternal life. Jesus approved the first two commandments as the right answer. "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself;" but he also reminded him, "This do, and thou shalt live."


