Morrison Cave Is

New Attraction for

Montana Vacationers For several years passengers on Jefferson canyon, Montana, have looked across the Jefferson river and observed work crews building trails and boring entrances on the face of the towering canyon wall. These America's most recently opened major cave located on the main electrified line of the Milwaukee road just 22 miles west of Three Forks, Mon-

tana, and 50 miles east of Butte. The 2,770 acre plot high up in the Tabacco Root mountains was formerly known as the Lewis and Clarke National Monument. After several years of exploration and development under the direction of the National Park Service, it was established last year as "Morrison Cave State Park, and the public was ad-

Morrison Cave was discovered in 1902 by Dan Morrison, and was privately owned for many years. Since it has become a part of the public domain, the cave has been considtransportation. Inquire 322 Wisconsin erably enlarged through the discovery of new chambers and the careful opening of safe passages. A 500 foot tunnel was drilled and blasted from the lowest level of the cave to a trail on the face of the mountain. This relieves visitors of the need of making the rather strenuous climb back to the mouth, and makes the trip an easy one.

> According to government men who have studied caves extensively, Morrisson Cave is unexcelled for the delicate carving and coloring of its formations. The total distance from the mouth to the bottom of the cave is about three-quarters of a mile and comprises seven chambers of varying size connected by intricate pas-

from palest buff through all the shades of yellow into deep reddish browns.

Like most large caves, Morrison Cave maintains a constant temperature through the year. In winter or in mid-summer, it is always about 52 degrees within a few yards of the entrance.

From the automobile parking space, there is a walk of about three-quarters of a mile up a wide inclined trail to the mouth of the cave. And there the visitor is rewarded by a truly magnificent view of the Jefferson river valley, the Madison and Gallatin mountain ranges. Visitors are equipped with lamps and are guided through the cave by competent men who explain the mysteries of its still-growing formations.

Travelers on the Milwaukee Road en route either to Yellowstone or the Pacific Northwest may stop off and visit Morrison Cave. The railroad arranges motor transportation either from the station at Three Forks or from nearby Gallatin Gateway Inn.

Cake Making Tips To Aid Beginners

"Licking the howl" used to be important activity in a warm kitchen on cake-baking day. It still is a gleeful pastime for young ones who cannot wait for the cake itself to come out of the oven. However, "licking the bowl" is like seeing a movie preview-exciting, but not half so satisfying as the real thing. The cake is the thing.

Never before has cake-making been so easy and so economical. Reliable recipes, convenient kitchen equipment, and ingredients of good quality have made it so. With careful attention to receipe directions, homemakers can turn out prize winners every time.

For best results, eggs and shortening for a cake should be at room temperature. Sugar stirs more easily into soft shortening. Shortening and sugar are creamed together until the mixture becomes smooth and soft as very thick cream an important step in making a cake. The idea in creaming is to dissolve the sugar, if possible.

Properly beaten eggs for cakes are frothy, with the whites and yolks well mixed. Most homemakers prefer to use a rotary egg beater. If egg whites are folded in at last, they should be glossy and moist, rather than dull and dry. The trick is to beat them only until the

Usually cakes are combined by adding dry and liquid ingredients alternately. This means that about a fourth of the flour mixture is then a third of the liquid, then a fourth of the flour, and so on until all is used. It is best to add the flour at the first and then again at the last. This helps prevent the batter from "curdling." Batter is beaten just enough to become smooth after each addition of flour and of liquid. Cakes need to be mixed lightly and quickly.

Flavoring may be put into the cake as the last ingredient. Or, it may be added to the creamed sugarand-shortening mixture, since a few more stirs of this mixture are fine for good cake texture.

Cakes made with butter or shortening are baked in well-greased pans. Unwaxed paper, placed in the bottom of layer or loaf pan, aids removal of the baked cake from the pan. Sponge and angel food cakes are always baked in ungreased pans.
