

Survey Show Gas Supply Ample to Meet Emergency Need

A survey made of gas facilities in Waukegan, North Chicago and its immediate area shows that there is an ample supply of gas to meet any emergency that might be caused by the necessities of national defense.

J. G. Hart, manager of the North Shore Gas company, said today that his company serving the North Shore is in an excellent position to meet any emergency that may result from increased demands created by a national defense program or by war.

"With our gas plant being of the most modern type and with ample gas mains serving the industrial gas area of the North Shore, we are in position to meet not only the present needs of all of our customers, but also additional utility demands which might develop under national defense or war conditions," said Mr. Hart.

Waukegan, being an industrial center, there has been much discussion among some businessmen that an effort be made to launch a campaign to attract more factories to this vicinity and if this is done, the factor required for additional supply of industrial gas will cause no concern, said Mr. Hart.

The company's fuel requirements are adequately protected by contracts with the largest producers of coal in the nearest available fields. Transportation facilities for the

bringing of this coal to the plant are numerous and efficient, Mr. Hart said.

"Many of our employees saw service during the last war, either in war service or in the actual operation of our property under war conditions and practically 100 per cent of the key men of this company are in this group. Our company organization functions smoothly, because of long association and experience of the operating, supervisory and managerial personnel. A great majority of our operating employees have been with the company for more than 10 years and even with the transfer of younger men to other activities, the company could function efficiently and economically.

"It has always been the policy of our company to keep its equipment in an excellent condition for regular service to its customers, and this will stand it in good stead to meet possible emergency conditions."
