given considerable attention. There has been a growing feeling among many citizens in the community that the attitude of the police department toward speeders has been one of passive resistance. In justice to the department it must be pointed out that with the current equipment and personnel available an effective campaign to slow down the driving tempo of some of our amateur Wilbur Shaws is distinctly handicapped. The direction of traffic in the central part of the city during rush hours and the watching of crossings at schools leaves little opportunity for the constant cruising in the outlying areas so necessary to effective speed control.

Commissioner Sharp went on record as heartily in support of Commissioner Swanson's contention that something must be done about this problem. The discussion boiled down to the realization that the only equitable solution to the problem was to enlarge the police department. Just where the money is going to come from to pay for this much needed improvement was not arrived at. In the meantime, however, take a tip from your correspondent and ease up on the accelerator. The police department has that crusading look in its eye. The word has gone out to get the speeders so don't say you weren't warned.

City Clerk Musser started to read the appropriation bill for the current fiscal year. However, it looked so long and formidable that the council voted to dispense with the reading and voted to post it for public inspection.

Along with speeders, dog owners without licenses for their pets are also slated for official castigation. Mayor Ronan was particularly strong in his warning toward anyone falling in this category.
