Do you know your police force? Most of us are ignorant of the various duties, activities and outside interests of the police officers in

Highland Park. Supplementary to the daily routine of the officers, they have bowling matches, golf and shooting com-

petition. On their one-day-off every two cal police headquarters. weeks, the police devote much of their time to home and the family. In the summer months, they play golf at the local country clubs.

During the winter the force has a bowling team which competes with other Northshore police organizations.

In the basement of the city hall, our police have access to a shooting range. Officers have individual matches within the force, or compete against Wilmette, Winnetka, Lake Forest, Glencoe and Lincolnwood police departments.

Officer Wilson Richardson makes the practice bullets for the local police. Each man is issued 50 shells monthly. Shooting is done at times of leisure, usually before going on duty.




