GRADUATE WITH HONORS

Jim Zischke was awarded the Arthur Somerville Reid medal presented annually for many years by the late Mrs. Simon Somerville Reid of Lake Forest, as a memorial to her son, Arthur Somerville Reid, of the class of 1893, and now sustained by her granddaughter, Miss Lilace Reid Barnes, and is awarded to that member of the graduating class who has stood second in scholarship during his junior and senior years.
