Mrs. W. A. Tennerman, who will serve as a Counselor, will leave for Jacksonville on Friday, and Miss Enith Uchtman, who was selected and sponsored by Deerfield Unit No. 738, American Legion Auxiliary, will leave on Sunday morning, with other girls from Chicago and vicinity.

The American Legion of Illinois for many years has had the coveted honor of leading the nation in youth activities and without a doubt, Boys' State, a product of this department, has played a leading role. The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Illinois, is following in the footsteps of the Legion and this year will inaugurate a Girls' State program.

Girls' State will be carried on lines similar to Boys' State, with the prime objective being to teach the girls, in an interesting way, more about our government. The entire program is non-partisan. Mrs. George F. Cassidy, department president, when interviewed stated that it could be summed up in one sentence: "Realizing that the America of tomorrow lies in the hands of the youth of today, we have made the training of that youth a major objective, teaching them the value of loyalty and service... a better citizenry through a better knowledge of the principles for which our government stands."

Illini Girls' State will be held in Jacksonville, Ill., amid the beautiful and cultural surroundings of MacMurray college, from June 23 to June 29, inclusive. MacMurray college is recognized as one of the outstanding girls' schools in the middle west and the American Legion Auxiliary is proud to invite girls to attend Girls' State on this campus.

The administration and instruction at Girls' State will be under the guidance of competent and experienced leaders, and the girls will enjoy the company of outstanding girls from all parts of Illinois. Among the requirements to be selected, a girl must be a Junior or Senior in High school; she must be recommended by her principal as to her qualities of scholarship, leadership, etc.; and she must be sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary, the Legion, individual Auxiliary or Legion members, or their affiliated groups. All applications must be in Department Headquarters by June 10.

The nearness to Springfield will make it possible for the girls to be taken on trips to Lincoln's home, Lincoln's tomb, the Centennial building, the state offices and departments and the Legislature, if it is in session, and New Salem.

Gus Sonnenberg vs. Fred Grubmeier in All Star Card June 21

"Dynamite" Gus Sonnenberg, former all-American football star from Dartmouth university who first introduced football tactics in the sport of wrestling when he won the world's heavyweight championship from Ed "Strangler" Lewis with a flying tackle, will meet Fred "Legs" Grubmeier, Iowa's great body scissors expert, in one half of a double main event headlining the third all-star wrestling card of the summer season in "Peg's" Open-air Arena near Grayslake, Friday night, June 21.

The other half of the twin feature pits rough-house Rudy Kay, Chicago's own Dead-end Kid, against clever and speedy "Tiger" Jack Moore, who gave Ruffy Silverstein his toughest Lake county match in last week's semi-windup.

Although Sonnenberg's is one of the best known names in wrestling, the match between Kay and Moore may be the best of the entire evening. Last week rough Rudy completely blew up when the referee tried to stop him in a match with McMillen. Rudy just wouldn't be stopped and before the fray was over he had delivered rights to the jaws of referee Tony Hadjek, promoter Fred Kohler, 220-pound athletic commission inspector Sam Gornstein, and numerous spectators who joined in the riotous battle against slugging Rudy.

Moore will be remembered here for a long time for his great match with Ruffy. Fans say it was the most scientific encounter ever witnessed here.

Form Organization 'Let's Keep Out of War' At Evanston Meeting

Thirty North Shore residents, members of various community organizations, last Sunday night formed an organization named Let's Keep Out of War—North Shore Citizens Committee. The meeting was held at the Evanston Y.M.C.A.

A five-point platform was agreed upon, officers were elected, and plans for immediate activities were begun. The Let's Keep Out of War platform reads:

1. A non-partisan political attitude.
2. A determination to vote only for candidates who will come out on an unequivocal keep-up-out-of-war platform.
3. No change in the Neutrality act.
4. A stand against repeal of the Johnson act.
5. Opposition not only to sending expeditionary forces abroad but also to any use of navy, army or air forces outside this hemisphere.
