The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "That God is a corporeal being, nobody can truly affirm. The Bible represents Him as saying: 'Thou canst not see My face; for there shall no man see Me, and live.' Not materially but spiritually we know Him as divine Mind, as Life, Truth, and Love. We shall obey and adore in proportion as we apprehend the divine nature and love Him understandingly, warring no more over the corporeality, but rejoicing in the affluence of our God" (p. 140).

Summertime Cowboys Ride the Range on Montana Ranches

If the steady popularity of "horse opera" movies, of comic strips and radio programs based on western life isn't enough to convince you that most adult Americans cherish a secret longing for the life of a cowboy, just come out to a dude ranch. You'll find that an ever-increasing number of men and women, young and old, are turning to this new kind of vacation for the thrill of fresh adventure.

Busy executives and professional men, debutantes and mothers of families all respond wholeheartedly to the lure of ranch life. And no wonder. For "dudes" are welcome guests whose happiness takes first rank with everyone on the ranch from

the owner to the youngest and humblest hand.

There is no finer dude ranch country than in the mountains of Montana. And there are no finer, more hospitable ranches than those centering around the towns of Baker, Forsyth, Harlowton, Martinsdale, Great Falls, Butte and Missoula—all reached by the main, electrified line of the Milwaukee road on the air conditioned Olympian.

How do you go about picking a suitable ranch? The method is simplicity itself. Railroad travel agents will gladly supply you with detailed information, and give you the benefit of their own experience. Or you can simply go out to Gallatin Gateway Inn. Located about 35 miles south of Three Forks, the Inn is in the heart of the Rocky mountain recreational region, and is an ideal headquarters for surveying the many ranches nearby in the Gallatin and Madison river valleys. You can visit half a dozen of them in a couple of days and select the one that suits your own taste.

It isn't at all necessary to "rough it" on a ranch. Even the more modest ones offer thoroughly comfortable accommodations with simple, modern conveniences, while the more elaborate layouts are really luxurious. Living quarters may be either in the main lodge or in private cabins. The food is uniformly good and is served in quantities that may seem staggering the first day, but that turn out to be just right for mountain appetites.

The life is thoroughly informal. Guests dress either in conventional riding clothes or in the popular blue denim "levys" with cowboy boots or

stout shoes. Leather gloves, a warm sweater and a windbreaker, just about complete the wardrobe requirements.

Activities, of course, center around the corral, and a horse is pretty much your constant companion. It doesn't matter whether you can ride or not. You'll want to, and you'll learn with amazing rapidity under the guidance of an experienced wrangler. It won't be long before you'll be a veteran going off on packtrips, riding skyline trails or exploring green forests with your fellow guests.

Trout fishing is popular, too, and is unexcelled in the tumbling mountain streams. Rainbows, brown trout, cutthroat and loch leven are all takes, and all in good sizes. Bring your own tackle if you're a serious fisherman. Otherwise, you can get all the tackle you need and a fishing license right at the ranch.

Some ranches have tennis courts and trap or skeet shooting. Practically all of them have swimming holes or pools, and horseshoes for "barnyard golf." In any case, you'll have more than enough to occupy your time. For there are always cowboy songs and stories to be learned, rope tricks and pack knots to be mastered, and maybe a little trick riding as well. So come on

out to Montana and make your temporary home on the range for a happy and healthful vacation.
