Ye old column is dedicated to those local golf aspirants who know M. MURPHY appointment to see these. Call Lake Forvery little about the lingo of the game . . . and maybe a few facts concerning the functioning and implements used therein. Let's hope this doesn't seem too naive . . . which it will undoubtedly be to golf participants. Usual paraphenalia concerning forthcoming events on the local links will be found in the latter section of the column.

Now for this little game called golf. When one sees action pictures of good golfers in the news, one thinks how really simple the game is . . . if one knows how to swing. I think swinging is the most important part of the game. Every time I swing the club, clouds of turf accompany the ball. When the rotund, white missle ascends in the air, most new golfers find that it invariably curves one way or the other . . a hook or a slice. One is as bad as the other. The green player en-

deavors to overcome a hook and developers a violent slice . . . that's my experience. Finally when the ball has been

dubbed, sheed, hooked and topped . , the player naturally becomes slightly exasperated. Another four strokes and the poor sweating golfer finds himself on the green . . . quite at loss as to what the next move may be. He hauls out a rusty putter . . . putts and screams in rage when the ball rolls gently into a convenient sand trap. After bashig clouds of sand into the air . . he finally connects with the long lost ball, and sends it whistling over the green onto another fairway. About this time, clubs begin to fly through the air . . . oaths are being flung through foamed lips and hankerchiefs are wiping watery foreheads. Yes, this funny game seems easy,

but it really fools one. The hook is the greatest pitfall for the new golfer, in my humble estimation. It is the most baffling problem in this popular pastime. Slicing can be overcome, as can hooking, simply by altering the grasp on the club, so I've been told. Better take lessons, and start out on the right path, They call golf fun, but I get the biggest kick out of seeing so many unhappy, wornout, hungry looking faces while out on the links. Golf is improved by frequent practice . . . and requires much perseverance and patience . . little progress can be made without

any of these qualities in the player. Well, I'll point out a few more facts concerning the game next week. Bye the bye, this peculiar game was anciently known as Goff, or Gowff and was a game of Dutch origin, but generally identified with Scotland, where as early as 1457 the local Parliament inveighed against its abuse . . . and whence it has become popularized throughout the English-speaking world.
