Ford and Mercury July Sales Reach High 1940 Level

Dearborn, Mich., Aug. 7—Retail sales of 90,294 Ford cars and trucks and Mercury cars in the United States during July gave Ford dealers the largest month of the model year with the single exception of March.

The commercial car and truck sales for the month not only exceeded every July since the introduction of the V-8 but topped every July total as far back as 1930, it was said.

Used car and truck sales also continued at high levels, with July totals the second highest of the year.

Mrs. Frank Cain Former President Woman's Club Dies

Mrs. Frank R. Cain, former Ravinia resident and president of the Highland Park Woman's club from 1921-1923, died Friday in Redwood City, Calif.

As president of the Highland Park Woman's club, Mrs. Cain believed that the club should have a home of its own. With this in view she was instrumental in securing the Ritter property at the corner of Sheridan and Elm place on which the present club now stands.

During the erection of the club auditorium, Mrs. Cain served as chairman of the Building committee. Aside from her activities in the Highland Park Woman's club, the deceased did a great deal of civic work both in Ravinia and Highland Park.

Mr. and Mrs. Cain left Highland Park some years ago, going to Melo Park, Calif., where they built an attractive home on a four acre tract and surrounded themselves with California's beautiful flowers.

Ever active, she became interested in Architectural drawing and was awarded several competitive prizes for drawings submitted to California realtors.

She was an ardent worker and was happiest when she was engaged in some educational work or worthwhile project. A lover of the beautiful, she studied nature's wonders and could name every flower.

For years after her removal from Highland Park, Mrs. Cain was a subscriber to THE HIGHLAND PARK PRESS.

Her only survivor is a niece, Mrs. Roy Moffitt who lives at 1014 Oakwood Ave., Wilmette.
