**Propose Merger Of Coke and Gas Firms for Economy**

ity on February 1, 1937, of an issue of \$3,855,000 of First Mortgage 5% Bonds of the Gas Company. In order to assist in refunding the First Mortgage Bonds of the Gas Company, which might not otherwise have been effected, the Chemical Company made its credit available by joining in the issuance of the Joint Bonds and mortgaged its properties as part of the security therefor; to permit it to assist, the Chemical Company called for redemption, at a premium, its own bonds then outstanding which would otherwise not have matured until 1947.

From the standpoint of your interests in the Gas Company it was imperative that a means be found to refund the maturity of the First Mortgage Bonds on February 1, 1937, and it is now imperative that a means be found to refund the Joint Bonds at or prior to their maturity on January 1, 1942. Your position as a holder of Preferred Stock of the Gas Company has been substantially improved in the past four years by the successful refunding in 1937 and the subsequent reduction, through sinking fund and purchase, in the amount of the Joint Bonds outstanding.

In order to prepare for the refunding of the Joint Bonds and to provide a way of satisfying the accumulated but unpaid dividends on the preferred stock of the Gas Company by the issuance of securities, the companies have for some years been considering the potential advantages of a combination of their properties into one ownership.

In line with that program it has been concluded that such combination will provide the most satisfactory way of meeting the maturity, so that the refunding may be effected by the issuance of the securities of but one company which will own all the operating properties of the present two companies, and will at the same time provide a means of simplifying the capital structures so that the common stock of the one company will represent the interests of all the stockholders of both present companies.

On May 11, 1940, Duff & Phelps, public utility analysts, who had no prior connection with either company, were engaged to make a general study of operations and other related factors of the Gas Company, with particular reference to the problems presented by the early maturity of the joint bonds and the

combination of the properties. That report has just been received. The development of the program of such vital importance to all classes of security holders of the companies and necessarily so complicated that careful preparation and substantial time were essential. Your welfare, in view of the near maturity of the joint bonds, is dependent upon the cooperative effort of the companies and their security holders, as it was in 1937.

Several steps remain to be taken before a plan can be submitted to you. The plan of combination will be submitted for approval to the Illinois Commerce Commission, which has jurisdiction over the affairs of the Gas Company, and to the Securities and Exchange Commission at Washington, which has jurisdiction over certain affairs of the companies by virtue of the fact that they are subsidiaries of North Continent Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. In addition, the plan to become effective must receive specifically the approval of the holders of the necessary proportion of the Gas Company's preferred stock. You will have the right to approve or disapprove of the proposed plan upon its submission.

When the proposed program shall have been formally prepared it will be submitted to the two commissions as a preliminary to submission in turn to all interested parties. Until that time you are urged to take no action which will interfere with the development of a cooperative program looking toward the preservation and protection, on a fair and equitable basis, of the interests of stockholders.

You may be assured that the plan will be submitted at as early a date as is possible in view of the work which still remains to be done. Meanwhile the Gas Company will continue its policy of affording information at any time to any of its stockholders.
