

**Dr. Bradley Will Address Legion At Woman's Club**

Dr. Preston Bradley, nationally prominent speaker and author, whose weekly talks over station WJJD have attracted country-wide attention, will be presented as a featured guest speaker by the Du-maresq Spencer Post of the American Legion, Tuesday evening, Oct. 23, at the Highland Park Woman's Club.

Commander George Abernathy under whose direction this event has been arranged states that Dr. Bradley, who has been pastor of the Peoples church in Chicago for the past 28 years, is considered one of the nation's foremost radio and public speakers. His weekly Sunday morning audience numbers more than a thousand and his radio audience today numbers several hundred thousand.

Dr. Bradley is well known for his participation in cultural, humanitarian and Americanism efforts having to do with present day problems and conditions. He is the author of several outstanding books including "Courage for Today," "Mastering Fear" and "Life and You." Commander Abernathy announces that Dr. Bradley's subject for his appearance in Highland Park will be "What Are We Facing?" and promises to be most timely and of unusual interest.
