WHEN YOU PRAY

by Dr. Charles Stelzle This is a very practical subject, because everybody prays-but most of us anxiously wonder why many of our prayers are not answered. It is for such that this article is written. It is based upon the highest authority obtainable. The Disciples of Jesus had observed that His prayers were always answered and so they came to Him with the request: "Lord, teach us how to pray." And Jesus answered: "After this manner pray ye." And He taught them what has come to be known as the fourteenth birthday at a party at "Lord's Prayer." So far as the records show, it is the only prayer that his home for a group of his school-Jesus ever taught His Disciples. It is used on public occasions when a mates last Thursday afternoon. prayer suitable to all classes, and people of all religious beliefs, is desired. But there probably isn't one person in a thousand who realizes what he is asking for when he presents its petitions.

Not that there is anything mysterious about it, or that it is difficult to understand—it is simply because the average man doesn't stop to think of the significance of the words he is using. Here are the opening sentences: "Our Father, Who are in Heaven; hallowed be Thy Name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth, as it is in Heaven."

It will be observed that no man can pray this prayer for himself alone. Notice the way it begins: "Our Father"—not "my Father." There isn't a single "I" or "my" in the entire prayer. It is a social prayer, as will be seen by its principal petitions: "Give us this day our daily bread; Forgive us our trespasses; Lead us not into temptation; Deliver us from evil." No man can offer this prayer unless he has the spirit of Brother-

If the spirit of this prayer were accepted what would happen? All wars would cease; we would have the solution of most of our social problems; unemployment wold be taken care of; human hatred would disappear. Suppose, for example, that the man who prayed for daily bread were deeply concerned about his neighbor also getting his daily bread? Nobody would go hungry.

Suppose the man who asked for forgiveness were anxious that others who had offended hi mshould also be forgiven? The man who prayed for "deliverance from evil," would take care that he did not lead others into temptation.

The next time you offer this prayer, stop and ask yourself-"Am I including my neighbor in this prayer?" If not, your voice will reach no higher than your own lips. If all men could pray this prayer in all sincerity, it would solve most of the problems of the world.
