The Band and Orchestra will be led by the head of the school Music department, Mr. Harold Finch, whose musicianship is well known in this vicinity, and the Chorus this year is under the direction of a musician of reputation in the Chicago area, Mr. Walter Aschenbrenner.

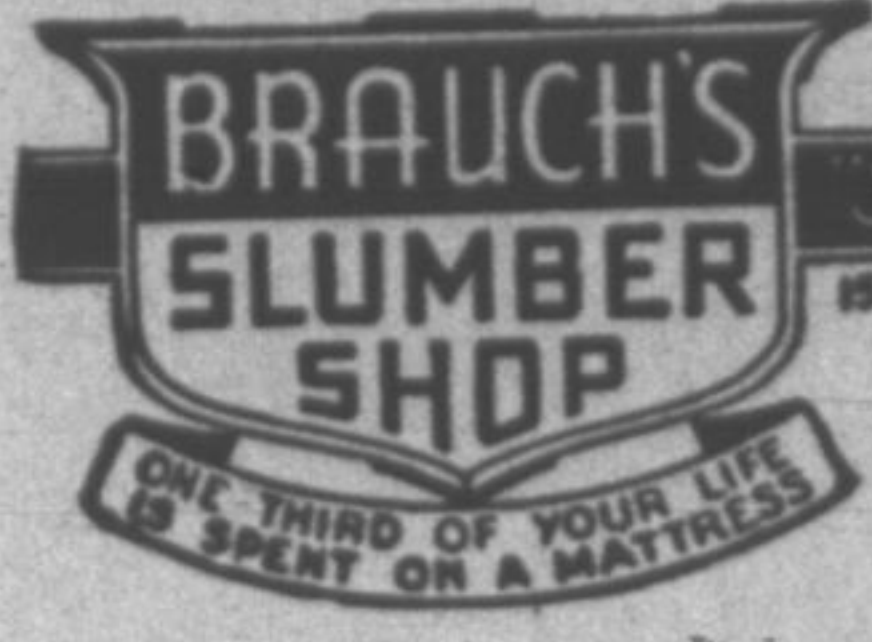
