> The House has instructed its conferees to the second conference to insist that the Nichol amendment be included. This proposal would make absolutely rigid the application of the quota system which provides that each state has a right to a certain number of governmental jobs based on its population. This system creates many administrative difficulties and is not in accord with the best merit principles since, for example, an applicant who passes a civil service examination with a relatively low mark but who happens to come from a state with an unfilled quota takes precedence over an applicant who passed the exam with a much higher mark but who comes from a state where the quota is already filled.
