### Cornelia Stone To Address Collectors Study Group Dec.

"Early American Weaving" by Cornelia M. Stone of Kankakee, Tuesday, December 3 at 10 o'clock a.m. will be the third in the series of lectures and talks sponsored by the Collectors' Study Group of the Highland Park Woman's club. A brief history of weaving and informal talk on her collection of old "coverlids," which she will bring with her, will be included by Miss Stone. A spinning wheel to show the preparation of threads and a small hand loom threaded with a colonial pattern to show how weaving is done will add to the presentation. Many small pieces of weaving illustrating early patterns will be shown.

Miss Stone has her home furnished with antiques and has herself woven the curtains, draperies, towels, etc., with which it is equipped. She also weaves their woolen clothing including the fine woollens from which her father's suits are tailored. Miss Stone has other interests besides weaving, among them is the collecting of old Chinese sleeve bands. In the August number of the magazine "Hobbies" appeared her article on this subject.

The Collectors' Study Group will have for their guests at this meeting the third and fourth grades of the Lincoln school which is taught by Miss Winifred Nichol. The group has been especially invited because they have obtained for the room an old spinning wheel and small loom preparatory to beginning the study of the age-old art of weaving.

Carroll Binder, the foreign news editor of the Chicago Daily News will speak at the high school next Wednesday evening, December 4, 8 p.m. Mr. Binder's talk will be especially interesting because of his close contact with all the foreign correspondents and his accurate knowledge of international affairs.
